AN ACT

Amending the act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), entitled 2 "A supplement to the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 'An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct 3 of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth 4 5 by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 7 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 8 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 9 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 10 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 11 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 12 13 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 14 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 16 17 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 19 number and compensation of the deputies and all other 20 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 21 commissions shall be determined, 'implementing the addition of section 4.1 to Article IV of the Constitution of 22 23 Pennsylvania; establishing the Office of Attorney General 24 elected by the citizens and setting forth powers and duties 25 of the Attorney General; creating an Office of General 26 Counsel and providing for legal services for Commonwealth 27 agencies; transferring, reorganizing or reconstituting 28 certain boards, commissions and agencies; placing certain 29 duties upon the courts and district attorneys; repealing 30 certain acts and parts of acts and making appropriations," further providing for legal advice and civil matters. 31

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 2 Section 1. Section 204(e) of the act of October 15, 1980
- 3 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys Act, is

- 5 Section 204. Legal advice and civil matters.

- 7 (e) Limitations in civil litigations. -- The Attorney General
- 8 shall not agree to the entry of a consent decree in any action
- 9 against the Commonwealth or any agency without the approval of
- 10 the Governor and notice to the General Assembly through the
- 11 offices of the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of
- 12 the House of Representatives. <u>If the Attorney General represents</u>
- 13 the Commonwealth or any agency in negotiation of a consent
- 14 decree, the Attorney General shall continue to represent the
- 15 Commonwealth or agency if the decree is challenged after entry.

- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
