## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for boating aid
- 3 victim good Samaritan civil immunity.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 8332.9. Boating victim aid good Samaritan civil immunity.
- 9 (a) General rule. -- Except as otherwise provided in this
- 10 section, a person who provides or obtains or attempts to provide
- 11 or obtain assistance for a victim of a boating rescue involving
- 12 death or serious bodily injury in which the boat is adrift or
- 13 the person in charge of operating the boat is disabled shall not
- 14 be liable for the civil damages as a result of any acts or
- 15 omissions in providing or obtaining or attempting to provide or
- 16 <u>obtain assistance.</u>

- 1 (b) Exception. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to any acts
- 2 or omissions intentionally designed to harm or any acts or
- 3 omissions that constitute gross negligence or willful, wanton or
- 4 <u>reckless conduct.</u>
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
