1 2 3 4 5	Amending Titles 23 (Domestic Relations) and 75 (Vehicles), of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for repeat offender license suspension; and further providing for suspension of operating privilege, for surrender of license and for occupational limited license.

7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Title 23 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
9	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
10	§ 6114.2. Repeat offender license suspension.
11	(a) NoticeAny court holding a defendant in indirect
12	criminal contempt under section 6114(a) (relating to contempt
13	for violation of order or agreement) shall notify the Department
14	of Transportation of its holding by sending a certified copy of
15	the order to the Department of Transportation.
16	(b) SuspensionThe Department of Transportation shall,
17	pursuant to 75 Pa.C.S. § 1532(e) (relating to suspension of

2	person who, while in this Commonwealth, is found to have
3	repeatedly violated a protection order issued under this
4	chapter, a foreign protection order or a court-approved consent
5	agreement.
6	Section 2. Section 1532 of Title 75 is amended by adding a
7	subsection to read:
8	§ 1532. Suspension of operating privilege.

10	(e) Domestic violence suspensionThe department shall
11	suspend the operating privilege of any person pursuant to 23
12	Pa.C.S. § 6114.2 (relating to repeat offender license
13	suspension). Upon the receipt of a certified copy of an order
14	pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S. § 6114.2(a), the department shall impose
15	a period of suspension as follows:
16	(1) For a second violation of the same order or
17	agreement, the period of suspension shall be 90 days.
18	(2) For a third or subsequent violation of the same
19	order or agreement, the period of suspension shall be six
20	months.

23	§ 1540. Surrender of license.
24	(a) Conviction of offenseUpon a conviction or a finding
25	of indirect criminal contempt by a court of competent
26	jurisdiction for any offense which calls for mandatory
27	suspension in accordance with section 1532 (relating to
28	suspension of operating privilege), the court or the district
29	attorney shall require the surrender of any driver's license
30	then held by the defendant and shall forward the driver's
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1 license together with a record of the conviction to the department. The suspension shall be effective upon a date 2 3 determined by the court or district attorney or upon the date of 4 surrender of the license to the court or district attorney, whichever shall first occur. 5 * * * 6 § 1553. Occupational limited license. 7 * * * 8 9 (d) Unauthorized issuance. -- The department shall prohibit 10 issuance of an occupational limited license to: * * * 11 12 (5) Any person who, at the time he applies for an 13 occupational limited license, has previously been granted such a privilege within the period of five years next 14 15 preceding such application. This paragraph shall not apply to 16 any person applying for an occupational limited license 17 during any period of suspension imposed pursuant to section 18 1532(e) (relating to suspension of operating privilege). * * * 19 20 (10) Any person whose operating privilege has been 21 suspended pursuant to either section 13(m) of the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled 22 23 Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, or section 1532(c) 24 [(relating to suspension of operating privilege)] unless the 25 suspension imposed has been fully served. * * * 26 27 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
