AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 26, 2001 (P.L.755, No.77), entitled "An 2 act establishing a special fund and account for money 3 received by the Commonwealth from the Master Settlement Agreement with tobacco manufacturers; providing for home and 5 community-based care, for tobacco use prevention and cessation efforts, for Commonwealth universal research 7 enhancement, for hospital uncompensated care, for health investment insurance, for medical assistance for workers with 8 9 disabilities, for regional biotechnology research centers, 10 for the HealthLink Program, for community-based health care 11 assistance programs, for PACE reinstatement and PACENET 12 expansion, for medical education loan assistance and for 13 percentage allocation and appropriation of moneys, "further 14 providing for adult basic coverage insurance program.
- 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 16 hereby enacts as follows:
- 17 Section 1. Section 1303(a) of the act of June 26, 2001
- 18 (P.L.755, No.77), known as the Tobacco Settlement Act, is
- 19 amended to read:
- 20 Section 1303. Adult basic coverage insurance program.

- 1 (a) Program establishment.--There is established in the
- 2 department an adult basic coverage insurance program. Fund
- 3 appropriations to the department for the program shall be used
- 4 [for contracts to provide basic health care insurance for
- 5 eligible adults and outreach activities. The department shall,
- 6 to the greatest extent practicable, ensure that all eligible
- 7 adults in this Commonwealth have access to the program
- 8 established in this section.] to implement a six-month
- 9 <u>eliqibility review for individuals enrolled in and receiving</u>
- 10 <u>insurance</u>, provided that the Insurance Department screens the
- 11 income and other eligibility requirements of recipients under
- 12 this program to ensure that individuals receiving health
- 13 <u>insurance benefits continue satisfying the eligibility</u>
- 14 requirements.

- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
