- 1 Designating March 16, 2003, as "Liberty Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 2 WHEREAS, James Madison, referred to as the Father of the
- 3 Constitution and elected as our nation's fourth president, was
- 4 born on March 16, 1751; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Since 1996 several states have observed March 16 as
- 6 "Liberty Day" to develop students' awareness of their rights and
- 7 responsibilities as citizens in accordance with the founding
- 8 documents of our democracy; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Booklets containing the Declaration of Independence
- 10 and the Constitution of the United States are distributed in
- 11 some states on March 16 as part of this observance; therefore be

- 2 16, 2003, as "Liberty Day" in Pennsylvania.
