## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of October 5 through 11, 2003, as "Fire
  Prevention Week."
- 3 WHEREAS, In 2001 there were 383,500 home fires in the United
- 4 States, resulting in 3,110 deaths, 15,200 injuries and \$5.5
- 5 billion in direct property damage; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Home fires, which have declined fairly steadily
- 7 since 1978, were down by nearly half in 2001; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Only 1999 had a lower home fire death total, 2,895,

- 1 in the past quarter-century; and
- WHEREAS, Nationwide, there is a home fire death every 170
- 3 minutes; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Half of all home fire deaths have resulted from
- 5 fires reported between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m., though only one-forth
- 6 of home fires occur during these hours; and
- WHEREAS, January is the peak month for home fire deaths,
- 8 February ranks second and December third; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Smoking is the leading cause of home fire deaths
- 10 overall, but in the months of December, January and February,
- 11 smoking and heating equipment have caused similar shares of fire
- 12 deaths; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home
- 14 fire injuries year-round; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Although children five years of age and under make
- 16 up about 9% of the country's population, they account for 17% of
- 17 home fire deaths, a risk twice the national average; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Adults 65 years of age and older also face a risk
- 19 twice the average, while people 85 years of age and older have a
- 20 risk that is almost 4.5 times more than average; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Only one-fifth of home fire deaths from 1989-1998
- 22 were caused by fires in which a smoke alarm was present and
- 23 operational; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Most fatal fires kill one or two people; and
- WHEREAS, In 2001, 22 home fires killed five or more people;
- 26 and
- 27 WHEREAS, These 22 fires resulted in 125 deaths, accounting
- 28 for 4% of all home fire deaths that year; therefore be it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 30 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania designate the week of October 5

1 through 11, 2003, as "Fire Prevention Week."
