A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the week of October 19 through 25, 2003, as "Radon 2 Action Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Exposure to radon poses significant health risks and
- 4 is considered to be the second leading cause of lung cancer next
- 5 to smoking, and smoking combined with elevated indoor radon
- 6 levels is an especially serious health risk; and
- WHEREAS, An estimated 40% of Pennsylvania homes have radon
- 8 levels greater than the national guideline of 4.0 pCi/L annual
- 9 average, and 49 of Pennsylvania's 67 counties have predicted
- 10 average indoor radon levels greater than 4.0 pCi/L; and
- 11 WHEREAS, As part of the Environmental Protection Agency's

- 1 State Indoor Radon Grant (SIRG) program, the Department of
- 2 Environmental Protection conducts a public awareness campaign in
- 3 connection with "National Radon Action Week"; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Under the SIRG program the Pennsylvania Department
- 5 of Environmental Protection awarded various Radon Awareness
- 6 Grants for projects to increase public and professional
- 7 awareness about the health risks associated with exposure to
- 8 radon and the need for increased testing and mitigation of radon
- 9 exposure to such organizations as the American Lung Association
- 10 of Pennsylvania, the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcasters,
- 11 the Mid-Atlantic Environmental Hygiene Resource Center and
- 12 Central Penn Parent; therefore be it
- 13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives declare the week
- 14 of October 19 through 25, 2003, as "Radon Action Week" in
- 15 Pennsylvania.
