- 6 expected to be diagnosed with breast cancer and 39,800 will die
- 7 from the disease; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Early detection can give women a five-year survival
- 9 rate of 97%; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Clinical breast examinations, regular mammograms and
- 11 breast self-examinations are the best means of detecting breast
- 12 cancer; and
- WHEREAS, Throughout the United States and this Commonwealth,
- 14 the American Cancer Society, the Pennsylvania Breast Cancer
- 15 Coalition and other national, State and local organizations are
- 16 working to raise funds, increase public awareness and support
