## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for no
- 3 limitation applicable and for other offenses.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Sections 5551 and 5552(c) of Title 42 of the
- 7 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- 8 § 5551. No limitation applicable.
- 9 A prosecution for the following offenses may be commenced at
- 10 any time:
- 11 (1) Murder.
- 12 (2) Voluntary manslaughter.
- 13 (3) Conspiracy to commit murder or solicitation to
- 14 commit murder if a murder results from the conspiracy or
- 15 solicitation.
- 16 (4) Any felony alleged to have been perpetrated in
- 17 connection with a murder of the first or second degree, as

- set forth in 18 Pa.C.S. § 2502(a) or (b) and (d) (relating to
- 2 murder).
- 3 (5) A violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3742 (relating to
- 4 accidents involving death or personal injury) or 3732
- 5 (relating to homicide by vehicle) if the accused was the
- 6 driver of a vehicle involved in an accident resulting in the
- 7 death of any person.
- 8 (6) Any sexual offense committed against a minor who is
- 9 <u>less than 18 years of age. As used in this paragraph, the</u>
- 10 <u>term "sexual offense" means a crime under the following</u>
- 11 provisions of Title 18 (relating to crimes and offenses):
- 12 <u>Section 3121 (relating to rape).</u>
- Section 3122.1 (relating to statutory sexual
- 14 assault).
- 15 <u>Section 3123 (relating to involuntary deviate sexual</u>
- intercourse).
- Section 3124.1 (relating to sexual assault).
- 18 Section 3125 (relating to aggravated indecent
- 19 assault).
- 20 <u>Section 3126 (relating to indecent assault).</u>
- 21 <u>Section 3127 (relating to indecent exposure).</u>
- 22 Section 4302 (relating to incest).
- 23 Section 4304 (relating to endangering welfare of
- 24 <u>children</u>).
- 25 Section 6301 (relating to corruption of minors).

- 28 § 5552. Other offenses.

- 30 (c) Exceptions.--If the period prescribed in subsection (a),

- 1 (b) or (b.1) has expired, a prosecution may nevertheless be 2 commenced for:
- 3 (1) Any offense a material element of which is either
- 4 fraud or a breach of fiduciary obligation within one year
- 5 after discovery of the offense by an aggrieved party or by a
- 6 person who has a legal duty to represent an aggrieved party
- and who is himself not a party to the offense, but in no case
- 8 shall this paragraph extend the period of limitation
- 9 otherwise applicable by more than three years.
- 10 (2) Any offense committed by a public officer or
- 11 employee in the course of or in connection with his office or
- employment at any time when the defendant is in public office
- or employment or within five years thereafter, but in no case
- shall this paragraph extend the period of limitation
- otherwise applicable by more than eight years.
- 16 [(3) Any sexual offense committed against a minor who is
- less than 18 years of age any time up to the period of
- 18 limitation provided by law after the minor has reached 18
- 19 years of age. As used in this paragraph, the term "sexual
- 20 offense" means a crime under the following provisions of
- 21 Title 18 (relating to crimes and offenses):
- 22 Section 3121 (relating to rape).
- 23 Section 3122.1 (relating to statutory sexual
- assault).
- 25 Section 3123 (relating to involuntary deviate sexual
- intercourse).
- 27 Section 3124.1 (relating to sexual assault).
- 28 Section 3125 (relating to aggravated indecent
- assault).
