## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for a grant program for class size reduction
- 2 activities; and imposing powers and duties on the Department
- of Education and the Secretary of Education.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Public School
- 8 Class Size Reduction Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 14 Commonwealth.
- 15 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 16 Section 3. Authorization of grants.
- 17 Beginning with the fiscal year 2005-2006 and in each fiscal
- 18 year thereafter, the department shall provide grants to school

- 1 districts for the purpose of class size reduction activities for
- 2 students enrolled in kindergarten through grade three.
- 3 Section 4. Criteria for award of grants.
- 4 A school district shall be eligible for a grant award if the
- 5 district:
- 6 (1) Is participating in a federally funded program of
- 7 class size reduction activities.
- 8 (2) Has a maximum class size in the district's
- 9 kindergarten through grade three classrooms not in excess of
- 10 the maximum number per classroom necessary for participation
- in the federally funded program of class size reduction
- 12 activities.
- 13 (3) Insures that teachers of classes qualifying under
- paragraph (2) participate in professional development
- activities designed to improve their abilities to teach
- 16 reading, writing and arithmetic.
- 17 (4) Adopts and implements in each school building where
- 18 a class size reduction program is in place a proven strategy
- 19 for engaging parents and other members of the community as
- 20 partners in the education of students.
- 21 Section 5. Use of grant funds.
- 22 Grant funds may be used for costs incurred by a school
- 23 district for class size reduction activities for students
- 24 enrolled in kindergarten through grade three if those costs:
- 25 (1) are not reimbursable under the federally funded
- 26 class size reduction program because of a lack of Federal
- 27 funds; or
- 28 (2) are not eligible for reimbursement under the
- 29 federally funded class size reduction program.
- 30 Section 6. Duties of secretary.

- 1 The secretary shall contract with a consortium of
- 2 universities for an evaluation of the effectiveness of class
- 3 size reduction programs. Program effectiveness shall be
- 4 evaluated at both the school building level and the school
- 5 district level. The secretary shall annually report:
- 6 (1) The results of the evaluation to the General
- 7 Assembly.
- 8 (2) Recommendations for legislation or other action
- 9 related to class size reduction activities.
- 10 Section 7. Expenditure estimate.
- 11 By March 31 of each year the secretary shall provide to the
- 12 General Assembly an estimate of the total cost of class size
- 13 reduction programs, including an estimate of State funds
- 14 required for the ensuing fiscal year.
- 15 Section 8. Funding.
- 16 Funding for the grant program under this act will be provided
- 17 by an annual appropriation by the General Assembly.
- 18 Section 9. Regulations.
- 19 The department shall promulgate rules and regulations to
- 20 administer and enforce this act.
- 21 Section 10. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately.
