- Designating a portion of State Route 104 in Snyder County as the 1 2
 - Timberwolves Memorial Highway 104th Infantry Division,
- 3 United States Army.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- Timberwolves Memorial Highway 104th Infantry 6 Section 1.
- 7 Division.
- 8 Findings. -- The 104th Infantry Division was activated on
- September 15, 1942, at Camp Adair and was named the 9
- 10 Timberwolves. After 18 months of training at Camp Adair and
- maneuvers in Eastern Oregon and the California-Arizona desert, 11
- the Timberwolves moved to Camp Carson, Colorado, for additional 12
- training before departing for Europe in August 1944. The 13
- Timberwolves were the first American division to land directly 14
- 15 on the European continent at Cherbourg, France, and Utah Beach.
- 16 The Timberwolves entered combat on October 23, 1944, with the
- First Canadian Army in Belgium and Holland. The Timberwolves 17

- 1 participated in the Northern France, Rhineland and Central
- 2 Europe Campaigns, suffering 6,223 casualties, including 1,447
- 3 killed in action during 195 consecutive days in combat.
- 4 (b) Designation. -- State Route 104 from State Route 45 in
- 5 Union County to Routes 11 and 15 in Perry County is hereby
- 6 designated the Timberwolves Memorial Highway 104th Infantry
- 7 Division, United States Army.
- 8 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 9 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway
- 10 under subsection (b) to traffic in both directions.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
