## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to the finances of the State government; providing for the settlement, assessment,
4	collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all other accounts
5	due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and
6	other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth,
7	or any agency thereof, including escheated property and the
8	proceeds of its sale, the custody and disbursement or other
9	disposition of funds and securities belonging to or in the
10	possession of the Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims
11	against the Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and
12	appeals to the courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to
13	the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth
14	and all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting
15	moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
16	and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth,
17	authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes
18	to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of
19	section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of
20	Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of
21	certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every
22	department, board, commission, and officer of the State
23	government, every political subdivision of the State, and
24	certain officers of such subdivisions, every person,
25	association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or
26	collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws
27	imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or
28	other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
29	every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the
30	Commonwealth, " further providing for reports to the Secretary
31	of Revenue; and establishing and providing for appropriation

1 to the Emergency Energy Assistance Fund.

2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania3 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 901 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343,
No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, amended December 2, 1976
(P.L.1274, No.283) and repealed in part April 28, 1978 (P.L.202,
No.53), is amended to read:

8 Section 901. Reports to the Secretary of Revenue. -- On the fifth day of each month, [and] or at such times and with such 9 10 frequency as may be prescribed by the Secretary of Revenue, it 11 shall be the duty of each judicial officer of a court not of record, city officer and county officer to render to the 12 13 Department of Revenue, under oath or affirmation, returns of all 14 moneys or as much as may be prescribed by the Secretary of 15 Revenue, received during the applicable period for the use of 16 the Commonwealth, designating, under proper headings, the source 17 from which such moneys were received, and to pay the same into 18 the State Treasury, through the Department of Revenue, less any 19 compensation and reimbursement for expenses allowable by law for 20 having made the collections.

21 Section 2. Article XVII-A of the act is amended by adding a 22 subarticle to read:

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1	<u>An amount equal to <del>1.0 mills of the utilities'</del> NOT MORE THAN</u>	<
2	1.0 MILL OF THE gross receipts tax collected during each fiscal	
3	year under Article XI of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2),	
4	known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, shall be appropriated	
5	annually FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2005, TO JUNE 30, 2006,	<
6	from the General Fund to the Emergency Energy Assistance Fund,	
7	to be administered by the Department of Public Welfare for	
8	State-funded emergency energy assistance if the Governor	
9	declares ISSUES A DECLARATION that either weather conditions,	<
10	natural or man-made disasters, or high energy prices or a	
11	combination thereof are a threat to public health within this	
12	Commonwealth and available Federal home energy assistance funds	
13	are not sufficient to meet this need. The Governor shall publish	
14	this emergency declaration in the Pennsylvania Bulletin along	
15	with the criteria and emergency regulations for this program AND	<
16	SHALL TRANSMIT COPIES OF THE DECLARATION TO THE CHAIRMAN AND	
17	MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE	
18	AND THE CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE APPROPRIATIONS	
19	COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.	
20	Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
