AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, further providing for examination of applicant for
- 3 driver's license.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 1508 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 1508. Examination of applicant for driver's license.
- 9 (a) General rule.--Every applicant for a driver's license
- 10 shall be examined for the type or class of vehicles that the
- 11 applicant desires to drive, and each driver who seeks renewal of
- 12 a driver's license shall be examined every tenth year for the
- 13 type of class of vehicles that the applicant desires to drive.
- 14 The examination shall include a physical examination, a
- 15 screening test of the applicant's eyesight and a test of the
- 16 applicant's ability to read and understand official traffic-
- 17 control devices, knowledge of safe driving practices and the
- 18 traffic laws of this Commonwealth, and shall include an actual

- 1 demonstration of ability to exercise ordinary and reasonable
- 2 control in the operation of a motor vehicle of the type or class
- 3 of vehicles for which the applicant desires a license to drive.
- 4 If the department finds it necessary to further determine an
- 5 applicant's fitness to operate a motor vehicle safely upon the
- 6 highways the department may require one or more of the following
- 7 types of examinations:
- 8 (1) A vision examination by an optometrist or
- 9 ophthalmologist.
- 10 (2) A physical examination pursuant to section 1508.1
- 11 (relating to physical examinations).
- 12 (3) A mental examination.
- 13 (b) Issuance of license to licensed nonresident.--A driver's
- 14 license may be issued to a person who has not had a learner's
- 15 permit but who at the time of application is of sufficient age
- 16 and has either a valid driver's license issued by another state
- 17 or a license issued by another state which has expired within
- 18 six months of the date of application under a law of that state
- 19 requiring the examination and licensing of drivers, providing
- 20 that the applicant demonstrates visual fitness. Also, the
- 21 department must be satisfied that the applicant's experience in
- 22 driving vehicles which may be driven by holders of the classes
- 23 of licenses sought by the applicant is sufficient to justify the
- 24 issuance of the license without further behind-the-wheel
- 25 training.
- 26 (c) Alcohol and drug use information. -- The traffic laws
- 27 examination shall contain at least one question relating to the
- 28 driver's ability to understand the effects of alcohol and drug
- 29 use on highway safety or the provisions of section 1547
- 30 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or

- 1 controlled substance). The driver's manual shall include a
- 2 section relating to the effects of alcohol and drug use on
- 3 highway safety, along with the related penalties.
- 4 (d) Police pursuit awareness.--The driver's manual shall
- 5 include a section summarizing the risks involved in fleeing or
- 6 attempting to elude a police officer. The section shall also
- 7 summarize the related penalties for a violation of section 3733
- 8 (relating to fleeing or attempting to elude police officer).
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
