AN ACT

Amending the act of July 8, 1986 (P.L.408, No.89), entitled, as 1 2 reenacted and amended, "An act providing for the creation of 3 the Health Care Cost Containment Council, for its powers and 4 duties, for health care cost containment through the 5 collection and dissemination of data, for public accountability of health care costs and for health care for 6 7 the indigent; and making an appropriation, "further providing 8 for data dissemination and publication and for expiration 9 date of act.

10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

11 hereby enacts as follows:

12 Section 1. Section 7 of the act of July 8, 1986 (P.L.408,

13 No.89), known as the Health Care Cost Containment Act, reenacted

14 and amended July 17, 2003 (P.L.31, No.14), is amended by adding

15 subsections to read:

16 Section 7. Data dissemination and publication.

1	(c) Information on infectionsNotwithstanding any other
2	provision of law to the contrary, hospitals shall post on a
3	quarterly basis, in a place readily open and available to the
4	public, information on infections, including:
5	(1) The number of infections identified by the hospital
6	through diagnosis and procedure codes and billed for on the
7	hospital's UB92 or its successor billing form. The number
8	shall be based on a list of codes provided to hospitals by
9	the council and shall be known as "UB identified infections."
10	(2) The number of hospital-acquired infections reported
11	to the council as identified in field 21d of the UB92 or its
12	successor billing form. The number shall be known as
13	<u>"hospital-acquired infections."</u>
14	(d) Payors
15	(1) For each submission in accordance with section 6 by
16	a hospital that contains information related to an infection
17	as described in subsection (c), a misadventure or other
18	patient safety issue, the council shall furnish relevant
19	information to the payor of record as identified by the
20	hospital. This subsection applies to those payors with at
21	least 1% of the health insurance market share in this
22	Commonwealth according to the Insurance Department. Each
23	payor shall verify whether the condition identified in the
24	submission has been paid and shall supply charge and payment
25	data, as outlined in a council statement of policy.
26	(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
27	contrary, the council may implement the provisions of this
28	subsection through a statement of policy. Nothing in this
29	subsection shall be construed to require the council to
30	promulgate regulations to implement the provisions of this
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1 <u>subsection</u>.

2 (3) The council may in its discretion release public
3 reports on the data under this subsection.

4 Section 2. Section 19 of the act is amended to read:5 Section 19. Sunset.

This act shall expire June 30, [2008] 2013, unless reenacted 6 prior to that date. By September 1, 2007, a written report by 7 8 the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee evaluating the management, visibility, awareness and performance of the council 9 shall be provided to the Public Health and Welfare Committee of 10 the Senate and the Health and Human Services Committee of the 11 House of Representatives. The report shall include a review of 12 13 the council's procedures and policies, the availability and 14 quality of data for completing reports to hospitals and outside 15 vendor purchasers, the ability of the council to become self-16 sufficient by selling data to outside purchasers, whether there is a more cost-efficient way of accomplishing the objectives of 17 18 the council and the need for reauthorization of the council. 19 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
