AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 19 20 commissions shall be determined, " providing for the Board of 21 Commissioners on Uniform State Laws; and making a related 22 repeal. 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 24 hereby enacts as follows: 25 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known

as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a

- 1 Section 480. Board of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws.--
- 2 (a) The Board of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws is
- 3 reestablished within the Office of General Counsel.
- 4 (b) The board shall be composed of the following
- 5 commissioners learned in the law:
- 6 (1) The Governor shall appoint four commissioners.
- 7 (2) The President pro tempore of the Senate shall appoint
- 8 two commissioners.
- 9 (3) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
- 10 appoint two commissioners.
- 11 (4) The Minority Leader of the Senate shall appoint two
- 12 commissioners.
- 13 (5) The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives
- 14 shall appoint two commissioners.
- 15 (6) The Attorney General shall serve as an ex officio
- 16 commissioner.
- 17 (7) The General Counsel shall serve as an ex officio
- 18 commissioner.
- 19 (c) A commissioner appointed under subsection (b) shall
- 20 serve a term as follows:
- 21 (1) A commissioner appointed under subsection (b)(1) shall
- 22 serve a term of four years, calculated from the date of
- 23 appointment.
- 24 (2) A commissioner appointed under subsection (b)(2), (3),
- 25 (4) or (5) shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing
- 26 authority.
- 27 (d) The General Counsel shall serve as chairman of the
- 28 board. Eight commissioners shall constitute a quorum.
- (e) The board has the following powers and duties:
- 30 (1) To examine subjects it deems necessary.

- 1 (2) To ascertain the best means to effect an assimilation
- 2 and uniformity of state legislation throughout the United States
- 3 <u>on the subjects examined under paragraph (1).</u>
- 4 (3) To meet with the National Conference of Commissioners on
- 5 Uniform State Laws, at annual and other sessions, to do all of
- 6 the following:
- 7 (i) Promote uniformity of state legislation in the United
- 8 States.
- 9 (ii) Join the conference in measures deemed most expedient
- 10 to advance the objective of paragraphs (1) and (2).
- 11 Section 2. Members of the Board of Commissioners on Uniform
- 12 State Laws on the effective date of this section shall continue
- 13 as commissioners for the balance of their terms.
- 14 Section 3. The provisions of 1 Pa.C.S. Ch. 31 are repealed.
- 15 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
