## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for protective
- 3 orders relating to the dissemination of certain victim
- 4 information.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 5920. Protective orders.
- 10 (a) Victim information. -- Upon the request of the attorney
- 11 for the Commonwealth or a child or adult victim, the court
- 12 shall enter a protective order prohibiting any party to or
- 13 attorney in, or the agent of a party to or attorney in, criminal
- 14 proceedings involving the visual or audio recording of sexual

- 1 conduct by a child from copying or disseminating any information
- 2 of a sexually explicit nature, including, but not limited to,
- 3 photographs depicting a person in a state of nudity, photographs
- 4 <u>of human genitalia, any information of the prior sexual history</u>
- 5 of the victim and any visual or audio recording of the sexual
- 6 <u>victimization</u>.
- 7 (b) Victim recording. -- Upon the request of the attorney for
- 8 the Commonwealth or a child or adult victim, unless the court
- 9 finds good cause to do otherwise, the court shall enter a
- 10 protective order prohibiting any party to or attorney in, or the
- 11 agent of a party to or attorney in, criminal proceedings
- 12 <u>involving the visual or audio recording of sexual conduct by a</u>
- 13 child from copying or disseminating a visual or audio recording
- 14 of the victim describing the victim's sexual victimization.
- (c) Exceptions.--Notwithstanding a protective order entered
- 16 under subsection (a) or (b), information or materials described
- 17 in subsections (a) and (b) may be copied or disseminated for the
- 18 purpose of:
- 19 (1) Providing discovery.
- 20 (2) Submitting evidence to a grand jury, a court, a
- 21 Federal agency, an agency of State government or a local
- 22 government for use in judicial or administrative proceedings.
- 23 (3) Having the information or materials examined by an
- 24 <u>expert witness for the court, the Commonwealth or any party.</u>
- 25 (4) Providing copies of the information or materials to
- 26 the parties' attorneys or agents.
- 27 (5) Sharing the information or materials with an agency
- of State government for use in carrying out duties imposed on
- the agency by statute.
- 30 (6) Use in law enforcement investigations.

- (d) Victim copy. -- Upon the request of the victim, the court 1
- 2 may order that the victim be provided with a copy of information
- 3 or materials described in subsections (a) and (b).
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
