A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the month of April 2005 as "Parkinson's Disease
- 2 Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is believed to affect
- 4 approximately 1 million people in the United States; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Approximately 40% of persons with Parkinson's
- 6 disease are under 60 years of age; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The cause of Parkinson's disease remains unclear,
- 8 but scientists believe that environmental factors trigger the
- 9 disease in people with a genetic susceptibility; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease has been described as being the
- 11 opposite of Alzheimer's disease: while Alzheimer's destroys the
- 12 mind, leaving the body intact and functioning, Parkinson's
- 13 destroys motor systems but allows mental function; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The two most prevalent types of Parkinson's disease
- 15 are early-onset Parkinson's disease and late-onset Parkinson's
- 16 disease; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Early-onset Parkinson's disease begins before age 50

- 1 and accounts for 5% to 10% of all cases; and
- WHEREAS, Late-onset Parkinson's disease starts at age 50 or
- 3 older and accounts for most cases of the disease; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Presently there is no cure for Parkinson's disease;
- 5 therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2005
- 7 as "Parkinson's Disease Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
