## AN ACT

Amending the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An 2 act empowering the General Counsel or his designee to issue 3 subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing 4 for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and 6 further providing for civil penalties and license 7 suspension, providing for duty of licensees, registrants, 8 certificate holders and permit holders. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 The act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), Section 1. 13 entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his designee 14 to issue subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; 15 providing for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the 16 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and 17 18 further providing for civil penalties and license suspension," is amended by adding a section to read: 19 20 Section 4.1. Duty of licensees, registrants, certificate

holders and permit holders.

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- 1 (a) General rule. -- A licensee, registrant, certificate
- 2 <u>holder or permit holder shall have a duty to provide</u>
- 3 information, documents and records requested by a licensing
- 4 board or licensing commission when the licensing board or
- 5 licensing commission is investigating or prosecuting a
- 6 <u>disciplinary matter</u>.
- 7 (b) Unprofessional conduct. -- Notwithstanding any other
- 8 provisions of law to the contrary, failure to provide
- 9 <u>information</u>, documents or records requested by a licensing board
- 10 or licensing commission as set forth in subsection (a) shall
- 11 <u>constitute unprofessional conduct.</u>
- 12 (c) Penalty. -- Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
- 13 contrary, a licensing board or licensing commission shall have
- 14 the power to refuse, suspend or revoke a license or registration
- 15 or certificate or permit or levy a fine up to \$1,000, or both,
- 16 <u>on a licensee, registrant, certificate holder or permit holder</u>
- 17 who fails to provide information, documents or records as
- 18 provided in this section.
- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
