AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 2 act relating to the public school system, including certain 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto, "providing for illegal drug and 6 substance testing and prevention and awareness program. 7 The General Assembly finds and declares that: 8 (1)Science-based tools and methods can be used to help 9 school entities effectively assess their facilities for the consumption and trafficking of illegal drugs and substances. 10 11 School-based assessment results permit school entity 12 administrators and boards of directors to employ a 13 combination of responses to address the prevention, 14 treatment, education and awareness of students regarding the 15 use of illegal drugs and substances and, if needed, actual testing of students for illegal drugs or substances. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 18 hereby enacts as follows: 19 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known

- 2 section to read:
- 3 <u>Section 1551</u>. <u>Illegal Drug and Substance Testing and</u>
- 4 Prevention and Awareness Program. -- (a) Each board of directors
- 5 of a school entity in this Commonwealth shall develop and
- 6 implement a policy regarding testing of the school entity's
- 7 physical facilities, its property and equipment and property
- 8 stored on the school entity's property or in the school entity's
- 9 facilities as follows:
- 10 (1) The testing shall be a science-based surface test that
- 11 <u>is proven to detect the presence of residues of illegal drugs</u>
- 12 <u>and substances on surfaces.</u>
- 13 (2) The school entity shall use positive testing results to
- 14 develop a focused program of illegal drug and substance abuse
- 15 prevention and awareness.
- 16 (3) The program of illegal drug and substance abuse
- 17 prevention and awareness shall be proactive and directed to the
- 18 students indicated in the testing results.
- 19 (4) The school entity shall inform parents of the testing
- 20 <u>results</u>.
- 21 (b) Each board of directors of a school entity shall develop
- 22 a statement of expectations for school behavior that includes
- 23 prohibitions against attending a district school or school
- 24 <u>district-sponsored activities under the influence of an illegal</u>
- 25 <u>drug or substance and the possession or use of illegal drugs or</u>
- 26 <u>substances in district schools or at school district-sponsored</u>
- 27 activities, and the consequences for violating the expectations
- 28 and prohibitions.
- 29 <u>(c) Each board of directors of a school entity shall provide</u>
- 30 a program of drug and substance abuse prevention and awareness

- 1 as a part of its health, fitness and physical education
- 2 <u>curriculum under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 4 (relating to academic</u>
- 3 standards and assessment).
- 4 (d) Each board of directors of a school entity shall provide
- 5 for the adequate notice of the statement of expectations for
- 6 school behavior to students and parents or quardians through
- 7 <u>dissemination of the written statement through the student</u>
- 8 <u>handbook</u>, <u>districtwide</u> <u>mailing</u> or <u>other</u> <u>method</u> of <u>notification</u>.
- 9 <u>(e) All policies and statements developed under this section</u>
- 10 shall take effect no later than the beginning of the 2007-2008
- 11 school year.
- 12 (f) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 13 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 14 subsection:
- 15 "Illegal drug and substance." Any drug or substance listed
- 16 <u>in the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The</u>
- 17 Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act.
- 18 "School district-sponsored activity." Any event under the
- 19 control, supervision or sponsorship of a school district using
- 20 <u>district personnel</u>, <u>district faciliti</u>es or district financial
- 21 <u>resources</u>.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007, or
- 23 immediately, whichever is later.
