14	(17) The employer of a child-care service employee,
15	<u>service provider, administrator or school employee who has</u>
16	been determined to be the perpetrator of a founded or
17	indicated report of child abuse. Information permitted to be

1	released to an employer under this paragraph shall be limited
2	to the final status of the child abuse report following the
3	investigation and disposition on appeal, if granted.

9	(e) Notice of founded or indicated report to certain
10	employersWhere the county agency determines that a complaint
11	of suspected abuse is a founded or indicated report involving a
12	perpetrator who is a child-care service employee, service
13	provider, administrator or school employee, the county agency
14	shall notify the employer, if the identity of the employer is
15	known to the county agency, in writing of the existence of the
16	founded or indicated report.

17 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
