1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	Amending the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), entitled "An act relating to the right to practice medicine and surgery and the right to practice medically related acts; reestablishing the State Board of Medical Education and Licensure as the State Board of Medicine and providing for its composition, powers and duties; providing for the issuance of licenses and certificates and the suspension and revocation of licenses and certificates; providing penalties; and making repeals," further providing for nurse-midwife license.

13	Section 1. Section 35 of the act of December 20, 1985
14	(P.L.457, No.112), known as the Medical Practice Act of 1985, is
15	amended by adding a subsection to read:
16	Section 35. Nurse-midwife license.

18	(c) Authorization
19	(1) A nurse midwife is authorized to provide and manage <
20	primary health care of women during pregnancy, childbirth and

1	the postpartum period, provide care of the neonate and
2	provide office gynecological care and family planning
3	services.
4	(2) A nurse midwife may, consistent with the midwife's
5	academic educational preparation and national certification,
6	prescribe, dispense, order and administer the following:
7	(i) Legend drugs and Schedule II through Schedule V
8	controlled substances provided that the midwife:
9	(A) Has successfully completed at least 45 hours
LO	of coursework specific to advanced pharmacology at a
L1	level above that required by a professional nursing
L2	education program.
L3	(B) In the two years prior to the biennial
L4	renewal of the nurse midwife's license, successfully
L5	completes at least 16 hours of continuing education
L6	in pharmacology approved by the board. The nurse
L7	midwife shall provide the board with evidence that
L8	the nurse midwife has completed such training as part
L9	of the biennial renewal process.
20	(C) Acts in collaboration with a physician as
21	set forth in a written agreement which shall at a
22	minimum identify the categories of drugs from which
23	the nurse midwife may prescribe or dispense and the
24	circumstances under which the collaborating physician
25	will personally see the patient.
26	(D) Acts in accordance with regulations
27	promulgated by the board, which shall not
28	unreasonably restrict the midwife's practice.

4	(1) A NURSE MIDWIFE IS AUTHORIZED TO PRACTICE MIDWIFERY <-
5	PURSUANT TO A COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENT WITH A PHYSICIAN AND
6	REGULATIONS PROMULGATED BY THE BOARD.
7	(2) A NURSE MIDWIFE MAY, CONSISTENT WITH THE MIDWIFE'S
8	ACADEMIC EDUCATIONAL PREPARATION AND NATIONAL CERTIFICATION,
9	PRESCRIBE, DISPENSE, ORDER AND ADMINISTER DRUGS, INCLUDING
10	LEGEND DRUGS AND SCHEDULE II THROUGH SCHEDULE V CONTROLLED
11	SUBSTANCES, PROVIDED THAT THE MIDWIFE DEMONSTRATES TO THE
12	BOARD THAT:
13	(I) THE NURSE MIDWIFE HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED AT
14	LEAST 45 HOURS OF COURSEWORK SPECIFIC TO ADVANCED
15	PHARMACOLOGY AT A LEVEL ABOVE THAT REQUIRED BY A
16	PROFESSIONAL NURSING EDUCATION PROGRAM.
17	(II) AS A CONDITION OF BIENNIAL LICENSE RENEWAL BY
18	THE BOARD, A NURSE MIDWIFE SHALL COMPLETE THE CONTINUING
19	EDUCATION REQUIREMENT AS REQUIRED BY THE ACT OF MAY 22,
20	1951 (P.L.317, NO.69), KNOWN AS THE PROFESSIONAL NURSING
21	LAW. IN CASE OF A NURSE MIDWIFE WHO HAS PRESCRIPTIVE
22	AUTHORITY UNDER THIS ACT, THE CONTINUING EDUCATION
23	REQUIRED BY THE PROFESSIONAL NURSING LAW, SHALL INCLUDE
24	AT LEAST 16 HOURS IN PHARMACOLOGY IN THAT TWO-YEAR
25	PERIOD.
26	(III) THE NURSE MIDWIFE ACTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH A
27	COLLOBORATIVE AGREEMENT WITH A PHYSICIAN WHICH SHALL AT A
28	MINIMUM IDENTIFY THE CATEGORIES OF DRUGS FROM WHICH THE
29	NURSE MIDWIFE MAY PRESCRIBE OR DISPENSE AND THE DRUGS
30	WUTCU DECITOR DEFEDDAT CONCIL TATTON OD COMANACEMENT

1	(IV) THE NURSE MIDWIFE ACTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
2	FOLLOWING RESTRICTIONS:
3	(A) A NURSE MIDWIFE SHALL NOT PRESCRIBE,
4	DISPENSES, ORDER OR ADMINISTER A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE
5	EXCEPT FOR A WOMAN'S ACUTE PAIN. IN THE CASE OF A
6	SCHEDULE II CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, THE DOSE SHALL BE
7	LIMITED TO 72 HOURS AND SHALL NOT BE EXTENDED EXCEPT
8	WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE COLLABORATING PHYSICIAN. IN
9	THE CASE OF A SCHEDULE III OR IV CONTROLLED
10	SUBSTANCE, THE PRESCRIPTION SHALL BE LIMITED TO 30
11	DAYS AND SHALL ONLY BE REFILLED WITH THE APPROVAL OF
12	THE COLLABORATING PHYSICIAN.
13	(B) A NURSE MIDWIFE SHALL PRESCRIBE, DISPENSE,
14	ORDER OR ADMINISTER PSYCHOTROPIC DRUGS ONLY AFTER
15	CONSULTING WITH THE COLLABORATING PHYSICIAN.
16	(3) A NURSE MIDWIFE MAY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH A
17	COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENT WITH A PHYSICIAN AND CONSISTENT WITH
18	THE MIDWIFE'S ACADEMIC EDUCATIONAL PREPARATION AND NATIONAL
19	CERTIFICATION, PRESCRIBE, DISPENSE, ORDER AND ADMINISTER:
20	(I) MEDICAL DEVICES.
21	(II) IMMUNIZING AGENTS.
22	(III) LABORATORY TESTS.
23	(IV) THERAPEUTIC, DIAGNOSTIC AND PREVENTATIVE
24	MEASURES.
25	(D) COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENTS THE PHYSICIAN WITH WHOM A
26	NURSE MIDWIFE HAS A COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENT SHALL HAVE HOSPITAL
27	CLINICAL PRIVILEGES IN THE SPECIALTY AREA OF THE CARE FOR WHICH
28	THE PHYSICIAN IS PROVIDING COLLABORATIVE SERVICES.
29	Section 2. The State Board of Medicine shall promulgate <-
30	regulations to implement the amendment of section 35 of the act

- within 18 months of the effective date of this act.
- 2 SECTION 2. THE STATE BOARD OF MEDICINE SHALL PROMULGATE <---
- 3 REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE AMENDMENT OF SECTION 35 OF THE ACT
- 4 WITHIN 12 MONTHS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT. THE BOARD
- 5 SHALL REPORT EVERY THREE MONTHS ON THE STATUS OF THE REGULATIONS
- 6 TO THE CONSUMER PROTECTION AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE COMMITTEE
- 7 OF THE SENATE AND THE PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE COMMITTEE OF THE
- 8 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
- 9 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
