## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 22, 1937 (P.L.1987, No.394), entitled, 2 as amended, "An act to preserve and improve the purity of the 3 waters of the Commonwealth for the protection of public 4 health, animal and aquatic life, and for industrial 5 consumption, and recreation; empowering and directing the creation of indebtedness or the issuing of non-debt revenue 7 bonds by political subdivisions to provide works to abate pollution; providing protection of water supply and water 8 9 quality; providing for the jurisdiction of courts in the 10 enforcement thereof; providing additional remedies for abating pollution of waters; imposing certain penalties; 11 12 repealing certain acts; regulating discharges of sewage and 13 industrial wastes; regulating the operation of mines and 14 regulating the impact of mining upon water quality, supply 15 and quantity; placing responsibilities upon landowners and 16 land occupiers and to maintain primary jurisdiction over 17 surface coal mining in Pennsylvania," providing for the permitting of oceangoing vessels in Lake Erie. 18
- 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 20 hereby enacts as follows:
- 21 Section 1. Section 1 of the act of June 22, 1937 (P.L.1987,
- 22 No.394), known as The Clean Streams Law, is amended by adding a
- 23 definition to read:
- 24 Section 1. Definitions.--Be it enacted, &c., That the

- 1 following words or phrases, unless the context clearly indicates
- 2 otherwise, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this
- 3 section.
- 4 <u>"Aquatic nuisance species" shall mean a nonindigenous species</u>
- 5 that threatens the diversity or abundance of native species or
- 6 the ecological stability of infested waters, or commercial,
- 7 agricultural, aquacultural or recreational activities dependent
- 8 on such waters.
- 9 \* \* \*
- 10 Section 2. The act is amended by adding an article to read:
- 11 <u>ARTICLE IV-A</u>
- 12 LAKE ERIE AQUATIC NUISANCE SPECIES
- 13 <u>Section 401-A. Permits for Oceangoing Vessels on Lake</u>
- 14 Erie.--Beginning January 1, 2008, all oceangoing vessels
- 15 engaging in port operations on Lake Erie in this Commonwealth
- 16 <u>shall obtain a permit from the department. The department shall</u>
- 17 issue a permit for an oceangoing vessel only if the applicant
- 18 can demonstrate that the oceangoing vessel will not discharge
- 19 aquatic nuisance species or, if the oceangoing vessel discharges
- 20 <u>ballast water or other waste or waste effluent, that the</u>
- 21 operator of the vessel will utilize environmentally sound
- 22 technology and methods as determined by the department, that can
- 23 be used to prevent the discharge of aquatic nuisance species.
- 24 The department shall cooperate to the fullest extent practical
- 25 with other Great Lakes basin states, the Canadian Great Lakes
- 26 provinces, the Great Lakes Fishery Commission, the International
- 27 Joint Commission and the Great Lakes Commission to ensure the
- 28 <u>development of standards for the control of aquatic nuisance</u>
- 29 species that are broadly protective of the waters of this
- 30 Commonwealth and other natural resources. Permit fees for

- 1 permits under this section shall be assessed as provided in
- 2 <u>section 6 of this act. The department shall promulgate rules to</u>
- 3 <u>implement this section</u>.
- 4 <u>Section 402-A. Violations.--Unless a discharge is authorized</u>
- 5 by a permit, order or rule of the department, the discharge into
- 6 the waters of Lake Erie in this Commonwealth from an oceangoing
- 7 vessel of any ballast water is prima facie evidence of a
- 8 violation of this article and subjects the responsible person to
- 9 the penalties prescribed in Article VI of this act.
- 10 Section 3. This act shall take effect January 1, 2008.
