A RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Memorializing the Congress of the United States to permit the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to reinstitute the electoral use of manual, old-style lever voting machines.
4	WHEREAS, The right to vote and the right to have one's vote
5	counted are key values of our democratic government; and
б	WHEREAS, The United States and the Commonwealth of
7	Pennsylvania are obligated to ensure that every person's vote is
8	counted; and
9	WHEREAS, The recent implementation of electronic voting
10	machines in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania was a source of
11	problems and frustration for voters on November 7, 2006, when
12	electronic voting machine glitches in several counties forced
13	polls to extend their hours of operation; and
14	WHEREAS, Recent studies by the Massachusetts Institute of
15	Technology have shown that electronic voting machines are less
16	reliable in accurately counting votes and do not produce an
17	independent paper record of each vote to be used in the case of
18	a recount or statistical sampling; and

WHEREAS, A report commissioned by the State of Maryland found
that the electronic voting system showed a high risk of
compromise; and

4 WHEREAS, A study group known as the Caltech-MIT Voting 5 Technology Project found that lever machines were more accurate than electronic voting machines; therefore be it 6 7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 8 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize Congress to permit the 9 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to reinstitute the electoral use of manual, old-style lever voting machines; and be it further 10 11 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to 12 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each 13 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
