18	district justice shall receive any annual salary insofar as

23	The salary of a district attorney and a part time district	
24	attorney shall be determined as follows:

8	jurisdiction to hear any challenge to or to render a declaratory	
9	judgment concerning the constitutionality of this subchapter.
