AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," further providing for Office for Safe Schools; and requiring the establishment of policies relating to bullying.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 1302-A(c) of the act of March 10, 1949
11	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
12	amended June 26, 1999 (P.L.394, No.36), is amended to read:
13	Section 1302-A. Office for Safe Schools* * *
14	(c) In addition to the powers and duties set forth under
15	subsection (a), the office is authorized to make targeted grants
16	to schools to fund programs which address school violence,
17	including, but not limited to, the following programs:
18	(1) Conflict resolution or dispute management.
19	(2) Peer helpers programs.
20	(3) Risk assessment, safety-related or violence prevention

1 curricula.

2 (4) Classroom management.

3 (5) Student codes of conduct.

4 (6) Training to undertake a districtwide assessment of risk
5 factors that increase the likelihood of problem behaviors among
6 students.

7 (7) Development and implementation of research-based
8 violence prevention programs that address risk factors to reduce
9 incidents of problem behaviors among students <u>including</u>, <u>but not</u>
10 <u>limited to</u>, <u>bullying</u>.

11 (8) Comprehensive, districtwide school safety and violence 12 prevention plans.

13 (9) Security planning, purchase of security-related 14 technology which may include metal detectors, protective 15 lighting, surveillance equipment, special emergency 16 communications equipment, electronic locksets, deadbolts and 17 theft control devices and training in the use of security-18 related technology. Security planning and purchase of security-19 related technology shall be based on safety needs identified by 20 the school entity's board of directors.

(10) Institution of student, staff and visitoridentification systems.

23 (11) Establishment or enhancement of school security24 personnel, including school resource officers.

(12) Provision of specialized staff and student training
programs, including training for Student Assistance Program team
members in elementary, middle and high schools in the referral
of students at risk of violent behavior to appropriate
community-based services, including mental health services.
(13) Alternative education programs provided for in Article
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1 XIX-C.

2 (14) Counseling services for students enrolled in3 alternative education programs.

5 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: Section 1303.1-A. Policy Relating to Bullying.--(a) No 6 later than June 30, 2007, each school entity shall adopt a 7 8 policy relating to bullying or amend the school entity's code of 9 student conduct required under 22 Pa. Code § 12.3(c) (relating to school rules) to include provisions relating to bullying. The 10 policy or amendment to the code of student conduct shall 11 12 delineate discipline consequences for bullying and may provide 13 for prevention, intervention and education programs, provided that no school entity shall be required to establish a new 14 policy under this section if one currently exists and reasonably 15 fulfills the requirements of this section. 16 (b) Each school entity shall distribute the policy relating 17 18 to bullying with the code of student conduct required under 22 Pa. Code § 12.3(c) and shall make the policy available on its 19 20 publicly accessible Internet website. 21 (c) Each school entity shall review its policy every three years and annually provide the office with a copy of its policy 22 23 relating to bullying, including information related to the 24 development and implementation of any bullying prevention, intervention and education programs. The information required 25 under this subsection shall be attached to or made part of the 26 annual report required under section 1303-A(b). 27 28 (d) For the purposes of this section, "bullying" shall have the same meaning as it is given in the section related to 29 definitions in the annual report on school violence and weapon 30

- 2 pursuant to section 1303-A(b).
- 3 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
