AN ACT

1 2	Providing for use of volunteer time by health care professionals in meeting continuing education requirements.
3	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4	hereby enacts as follows:
5	Section 1. Short title.
б	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Volunteer
7	Continuing Medical Education Act.
8	Section 2. Definitions.
9	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
10	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
11	context clearly indicates otherwise:
12	"Community-based health care clinic." A nonprofit health
13	care center located in this Commonwealth that provides health
14	care services to low-income and uninsured individuals and meets
15	either of the following criteria:
16	(1) serves a federally designated medically underserved
17	area, a medically underserved population or a health

1 professional shortage area; or

(2) serves a patient population with a majority of that 2 3 population having an income less than 200% of the Federal 4 poverty income guidelines, including: 5 (i) A federally qualified health center as defined in section 1905(1)(2)(B) of the Social Security Act (49 6 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1396d(1)(2)(B)) or a federally 7 qualified health center look-alike. 8 (ii) A rural health clinic as defined in section 9 10 1861(aa)(2) of the Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 11 U.S.C. § 1395x(aa)(2)), certified by Medicare. (iii) A hospital health clinic. 12 13 (iv) A free or partial-pay health clinic that provides services by volunteer and nonvolunteer health 14 15 care providers. (v) A nurse-managed health care clinic that is 16 managed by advanced practice nurses and is associated 17 18 with a department of nursing, a federally qualified 19 health center or an independent nonprofit health or social services agency. 20 "Health care professional." A physician, dentist, dental 21 22 hygienist, nurse, certified registered nurse practitioner or physician assistant licensed, certified or registered with any 23 24 of the licensure boards. 25 "Licensure board." Includes the following departmental 26 administrative boards within the Department of State: 27 The State Board of Medicine. (1) 28 (2) The State Board of Osteopathic Medicine. 29 (3) The State Board of Denistry. 30 (4) The State Board of Nursing.

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1 Section 3. Volunteer continuing education.

2 Beginning with the licensure period commencing after the 3 effective date of this act and following written notice by the 4 appropriate licensure board, health care professionals shall be permitted to apply volunteer time served in a community-based 5 health care clinic toward completion of mandatory continuing 6 education hours required by the appropriate licensure board. 7 8 Acceptable documentation of volunteer hours shall be done in accordance with applicable regulations. 9

10 Section 4. Annual report.

11 The Department of State shall submit a report to the chair 12 and minority chair of the Public Health and Welfare Committee of 13 the Senate and the chair and minority chair of the Health and 14 Human Resources Committee of the House of Representatives 15 detailing the number of health care professionals who have 16 applied volunteer hours served in a community-based health care 17 clinic.

18 Section 20. Effective date.

19 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
