AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Keystone Care Prescription Assistance Program
- 2 in the Department of Public Welfare to provide prescription
- drug assistance; and making an appropriation.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Keystone Care
- 8 Prescription Assistance Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Community-based health care clinic." A nonprofit health
- 14 care center located in this Commonwealth that provides health
- 15 care services to low-income and uninsured individuals, and meets
- 16 either of the following criteria:
- 17 (1) serves a federally designated medically underserved
- 18 area, a medically underserved population or a health

- 1 professional shortage area; or
- 2 (2) serves a patient population with a majority of that
- 3 population having an income less than 200% of the Federal
- 4 poverty income guidelines, including:
- 5 (i) A federally qualified health center as defined
- in section 1905(1)(2)(B) of the Social Security Act (49
- 7 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1396d(1)(2)(B)) or a federally
- 8 qualified health center look-alike.
- 9 (ii) A rural health clinic as defined in section
- 10 1861(aa)(2) of the Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42
- U.S.C. \S 1395x(aa)(2)), certified by Medicare.
- 12 (iii) A hospital health clinic.
- 13 (iv) A free or partial-pay health clinic that
- 14 provides services by volunteer and nonvolunteer health
- 15 care providers.
- 16 (v) A nurse-managed health care clinic that is
- managed by advanced practice nurses and is associated
- with a department of nursing, a federally qualified
- 19 health center or an independent nonprofit health or
- 20 social services agency.
- 21 "Department." The Department of Public Welfare of the
- 22 Commonwealth.
- 23 "Low-income adult." An individual who meets all of the
- 24 following:
- 25 (1) Is at least 19 years of age but less than 65 years
- of age.
- 27 (2) Resides in this Commonwealth for at least six
- 28 months.
- 29 (3) Has a household income that is less than 200% of the
- 30 Federal poverty limit.

- 1 "Prescription drug." A drug requiring a prescription in this
- 2 Commonwealth.
- 3 "Program." The Keystone Care Prescription Assistance Program
- 4 established in section 3, otherwise known as KeyCare.
- 5 "Registry." A listing maintained by the Department of Public
- 6 Welfare of free prescription drugs provided by pharmaceutical
- 7 manufacturers for dispensing at community-based health care
- 8 clinics.
- 9 Section 3. Establishment.
- 10 The Keystone Care Prescription Assistance Program (KeyCare)
- 11 is hereby established within the department to:
- 12 (1) Enable low-income adults without prescription drug
- coverage to be linked to an appropriate free or low-cost
- 14 prescription assistance program.
- 15 (2) Assist low-income adults who lack prescription drug
- 16 coverage in the application process for appropriate free or
- 17 low-cost prescription assistance programs.
- 18 (3) Create a registry of free prescription drugs
- 19 provided by pharmaceutical manufacturers that are made
- 20 available to community-based health care clinics for
- 21 dispensing to individuals receiving health care at that
- 22 clinic.
- 23 Section 4. Administration.
- 24 The department shall do all of the following:
- 25 (1) Establish and maintain an online database of free or
- low-cost prescription assistance programs.
- 27 (2) Assist low-income adults with the application
- 28 process for enrollment in appropriate free or low-cost
- 29 prescription assistance programs.
- 30 (3) Establish a toll-free telephone number for low-

- income adults to use to contact the department for assistance
- 2 in the program.
- 3 (4) Establish a public awareness campaign to educate
- 4 individuals about the program.
- 5 (5) Establish a registry of free prescription drugs
- 6 provided at no cost by pharmaceutical manufacturers for
- dispensing at community-based health care clinics.
- 8 (6) Establish agreements with pharmaceutical
- 9 manufacturers for prescription drugs that will be provided at
- 10 no cost and may be placed on the registry.
- 11 (7) Create a mechanism for community-based health care
- 12 clinics to access available prescription drugs placed on the
- 13 registry.
- 14 (8) Consult with the State Board of Pharmacy to maximize
- 15 resources.
- 16 Section 5. Limitations on payments by department.
- 17 The program shall not exceed the amount of funds available,
- 18 and any payment shall not constitute an entitlement from the
- 19 Commonwealth or a claim on any other funds of the Commonwealth.
- 20 Section 6. Appropriation.
- 21 The sum of \$1,000,000 is hereby appropriated to the
- 22 Department of Public Welfare to carry out the provisions of this
- 23 act.
- 24 Section 20. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 90 days.
