A RESOLUTION

- Designating Monday, September 24, 2007, as "Family Day A day
 to Eat Dinner with Your Children 2007" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Parents eating dinner frequently with their children
- 4 reduces the risk of a child's involvement in substance abuse;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, Research by The National Center on Addiction and
- 7 Substance Abuse (CASA) at Columbia University consistently finds
- 8 that the more often children eat dinner with their families, the
- 9 less likely they are to smoke, drink or use drugs; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The conversations that go hand-in-hand with dinner
- 11 will help parents learn more about their children's lives and
- 12 better understand the challenges their children face; and
- 13 WHEREAS, CASA created "Family Day A Day to Eat Dinner with
- 14 Your Children" in 2001 as a national effort to promote family
- 15 dinners as an effective way to reduce substance abuse among
- 16 children and teens; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Celebrated on the fourth Monday in September, the
- 2 observance emphasizes the importance of regular family
- 3 activities and encourages Americans to make family dinners a
- 4 regular feature of their lives; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Parental engagement is the most potent weapon in
- 6 preventing substance use and abuse among youths; therefore be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate Monday, September 24,
- 8 2007, as "Family Day A Day to Eat Dinner with Your Children
- 9 2007" in Pennsylvania and encourage all families in this
- 10 Commonwealth to begin making family dinners a regular feature of
- 11 their daily routine.
