- 10 influential teachers, and all parents and families have hopes
- 11 and goals for their children; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Parents' involvement in their children's learning
- 13 prior to school entrance is essential for school readiness; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Parents' involvement in children's education is a
- 15 determining factor in children's academic success; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania recognizes the important role that
- 17 parents, guardians, grandparents and other family members play
- 18 in children's learning and education; and

- 2 early childhood parenting supports that engage parents in their
