AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as
2	reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and
3	malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating
4	and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and
5	restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession,
6	consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding
7	in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic
8	liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the
9	persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and
10	duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing
11	for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores,
12	for the payment of certain license fees to the respective
13	municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain
14	nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure
15	without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures;
16	providing for local option, and repealing existing laws,"
17	further providing for limited wineries.

20	Section 1. Section 505.2(a)(4) of the act of April 12, 1951

21 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended

22 June 29, 1987 (P.L.32, No.14) and amended July 16, 2007

23 (P.L.107, No.34), is amended to read:

24 Section 505.2. Limited Wineries.--(a) In the interest of

promoting tourism and recreational development in Pennsylvania,
holders of a limited winery license may:

3 * * *

(4) At the discretion of the board, obtain a special permit 4 to participate in alcoholic cider, wine and food expositions off 5 the licensed premises. A special permit shall be issued upon 6 7 proper application and payment of a fee of thirty dollars (\$30) 8 per day for each day of permitted use, not to exceed [five (5)] thirty (30) consecutive days. The total number of days for all 9 10 the special permits may not exceed [forty (40)] one hundred (100) days in any calendar year. A special permit shall entitle 11 the holder to engage in the sale by the glass, by the bottle or 12 13 in case lots of alcoholic cider or wine produced by the permittee under the authority of a limited winery license. 14 15 Holders of special permits may provide tasting samples of wines 16 in individual portions not to exceed one fluid ounce. Samples at alcoholic cider, wine and food expositions may be sold or 17 18 offered free of charge. Except as provided herein, limited 19 wineries utilizing special permits shall be governed by all 20 applicable provisions of this act as well as by all applicable 21 regulations or conditions adopted by the board.

22 For the purposes of this clause, "alcoholic cider, wine and food expositions" are defined as affairs held indoors or 23 24 outdoors with the intent of promoting Pennsylvania products by 25 educating those in attendance of the availability, nature and 26 quality of Pennsylvania-produced alcoholic ciders and wines in conjunction with suitable food displays, demonstrations and 27 28 sales. Alcoholic cider, wine and food expositions may also 29 include activities other than alcoholic cider, wine and food displays, including arts and crafts, musical activities, 30
