| 12 | liable for damages on account of an injury to a person or |

| 14 | alien if all of the following conditions are satisfied: |
| 15 | (1) The unauthorized alien has been a resident of the |
| 16 | sanctuary municipality for at least six months. |
| 17 | (2) The unauthorized alien is convicted of a crime. |
| 18 | (3) The criminal activity is a proximate cause of the |

- 2 (b) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 3 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 4 subsection:
- 5 "Municipality." A municipality as defined under 1 Pa.C.S. §
- 6 1991 (relating to definitions).
- 7 <u>"Sanctuary municipality." A municipality which has adopted</u>
- 8 <u>ordinances</u>, <u>policies or procedures to encourage unauthorized</u>
- 9 <u>aliens to reside in the municipality. The term shall include</u>
- 10 ordinances, policies or procedures which do any of the
- 11 <u>following:</u>
- 12 (1) Prohibit, restrict or discourage municipal employees
- from sending, receiving or maintaining information regarding
- the immigration status, lawful or unlawful, of any
- individual, or exchanging the information with any other
- 16 Federal, State or local government entity.
- 17 (2) Prohibit, restrict or discourage municipal employees
- from asking individuals their citizenship or immigration
- 19 status.
- 20 (3) Provide public benefits, unless required by Federal
- or State statutes or court decisions, with the exception of
- 22 any of the following:
- (i) Emergency medical care.
- 24 (ii) Law enforcement, arrest, prosecution,
- 25 incarceration, detainment and related expenses.
- 26 (iii) Benefits provided to the public at large,
- 27 <u>including maintenance of roads, sidewalks, public parks</u>
- and similar government property.
- "Unauthorized alien." An alien who is not lawfully present
- 30 within the United States.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
