SENATOR PICCOLA, EDUCATION, AS AMENDED, MAY 4, 2010

AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," further providing for minimum number of days and school month.

 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Sections 1501 and 2523 of the act of March 10,
- 10 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
- 11 amended June 30, 1980 (P.L.279, No.80), are amended to read:
- 12 Section 1501. Minimum Number of Days; School Month.--(a)
- 13 All public kindergartens, elementary and secondary schools shall
- 14 be kept open each school year for at least one hundred eighty
- 15 (180) days of instruction for pupils. No days on which the
- 16 schools are closed shall be counted as days taught, and no time
- 17 shall be counted as a pupil session for any activity to which
- 18 admission is charged.

- 1 (b) No school district shall be required to change its
- 2 graduation schedule or require graduating students to return to
- 3 school after graduation to make up class days lost due to severe
- 4 weather conditions or, in the school year 1979-1980 for
- 5 situations beyond the control of the school district as a result
- 6 of major construction and renovation to the school building. No
- 7 district which makes a bona fide effort as determined by the
- 8 Secretary of Education to provide one hundred eighty (180) days
- 9 of instruction for graduating students shall receive less
- 10 subsidy payments or reimbursements than it would otherwise be
- 11 entitled to receive on account of the school year because of the
- 12 provisions of this section.
- 13 <u>(c)</u> Unless otherwise provided by this act, the board of
- 14 school directors in any district or joint board may keep such
- 15 other schools or departments as it may establish open during
- 16 such time as it may direct.
- 17 <u>(d)</u> Twenty days of actual teaching shall constitute a school
- 18 month.
- 19 (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
- 20 contrary, the Secretary of Education shall not permit a school
- 21 district to reduce the number of days of instruction due to
- 22 school closures resulting from severe weather conditions unless
- 23 <u>expressly authorized by an act of the General Assembly or the</u>
- 24 school district can demonstrate that the number of days where
- 25 schools were closed due to severe weather conditions exceeds the
- 26 number of remaining available days through June 30, including
- 27 those days on which schools were previously scheduled to be
- 28 closed. Except for graduating students as provided in subsection
- 29 (b), school districts shall utilize all available days through
- 30 June 30 of each school year, including those days on which

- 1 <u>schools were previously scheduled to be closed in order to</u>
- 2 provide one hundred eighty (180) days of instruction.
- 3 (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1502, the
- 4 board of school directors shall have the option of rescheduling
- 5 <u>instructional days on Saturday</u>, but for not more than one
- 6 Saturday per month, to make up instructional days lost from the
- 7 <u>adopted school calendar because school was closed as a result of</u>
- 8 <u>severe weather conditions. In those cases where a board of</u>
- 9 directors chooses to reschedule instructional days on Saturdays
- 10 in accordance with the provisions of this subsection, schools
- 11 within such board's jurisdiction shall not schedule tests or
- 12 <u>examinations on these Saturdays. Notwithstanding the provisions</u>
- 13 of section 1502(a), if the board of school directors reschedules
- 14 <u>an instructional day on Saturday, the schools may be open the</u>
- 15 following Monday.
- 16 (2) Where a school district uses a Saturday to make up
- 17 instructional days lost as a result of severe weather
- 18 conditions, a school district, intermediate unit or area
- 19 <u>vocational-technical school shall excuse a student to observe or</u>
- 20 participate in a religious activity or function upon the written
- 21 notification of such observance or participation by the
- 22 student's parent or quardian. A student's absence from school
- 23 pursuant to this subsection shall be considered an instructional
- 24 day and shall not be recorded as an absence on the student's
- 25 <u>attendance record or on the record of any group or class of</u>
- 26 which the student is a member. There shall be no penalty
- 27 <u>attached for any such absences pursuant to this subsection.</u>
- 28 (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 2523, the
- 29 Secretary of Education may not pay a school district its share
- 30 of the annual State appropriation for the noncompletion of

- 1 <u>instructional days not under this section or for the</u>
- 2 <u>noncompletion of instructional hours as permitted under section</u>
- 3 1504.
- 4 Section 2523. Schools Closed on Account of Contagious
- 5 Disease, etc.--[When] <u>Except as provided in section 1501, when</u>
- 6 any board of school directors or intermediate unit with respect
- 7 to area technical schools is compelled to close any school or
- 8 schools on account of any contagious disease, natural disaster
- 9 or other emergency or for the school year 1979-1980 on account
- 10 of major construction or renovation to a school building, not
- 11 including labor disputes involving school employes, and therefor
- 12 is unable to keep such school or schools open for the minimum
- 13 term required by this act, the Secretary of Education may pay to
- 14 such school district or intermediate unit any or all of its
- 15 share of the annual State appropriation as he deems proper.
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
