AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 1 2 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, for certain 4 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 5 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 6 7 ending June 30, 2011; to provide appropriations from the State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance 8 9 Fund, the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores Fund, the Milk 10 Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency 11 Medical Services Operating Fund, the Tuition Payment Fund, 12 the Banking Department Fund, the Firearm Records Check Fund, 13 the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund and 14 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund to the Executive Department; to 15 16 provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the 17 18 fiscal year July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal 19 year July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth and the 20 21 Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License 22 Fund moneys; to provide for the appropriation of Federal 23 funds to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth and for 24 25 the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011; and to provide for the 26 27 additional appropriation of Federal and State funds from the General Fund for the Executive Department of the Commonwealth 28 29 for the fiscal year July 1, 2010, to June 30, 2011, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the 30 close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010. 31

- 6 hereby appropriated.
- 7 (b) The Federal appropriations to the Department of Public
- 8 Welfare include any prior earnings that may be received during
- 9 fiscal year 2011-2012. In addition to the amounts specifically
- 10 appropriated herein to the Department of Public Welfare, all
- 11 moneys appropriated from the Federal Government during any
- 12 previous fiscal year which are expected to be received as
- 13 reimbursements may be carried forward until June 30, 2012, to
- 14 the extent that obligations are carried forward. In addition,
- 15 any reimbursements actually received to support such obligations
- 16 may also be carried forward.
- 17 Section 1804. Subgrants between Federal fund
- 18 appropriations. -- Subgrants may be made between Federal
- 19 appropriations without further approval of the General Assembly.
- 20 The Secretary of the Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to
- 21 the chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations
- 22 Committee of the Senate and the chairman and minority chairman
- 23 of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives
- 24 quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made
- 25 from a restricted receipt account without a specific
- 26 appropriation by the General Assembly.
- 27 Section 1805. Utilization of emergency Federal funds.--(a)
- 28 Federal funds available for costs and damages resulting from
- 29 natural disasters or civil disobedience may be added to an
- 30 appropriation contained in this act or to funds appropriated or

- 1 may be used for the purposes prescribed by the Federal
- 2 Government.
- 3 (b) In addition to the moneys appropriated by this act, all
- 4 moneys received from the Federal Government for the purpose of
- 5 disaster assistance or relief, or other moneys received as a
- 6 direct result of terrorist acts, moneys for homeland security
- 7 and defense and moneys for avian flu/pandemic preparedness shall
- 8 be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of
- 9 the General Fund to the departments, boards, commissions or
- 10 agencies designated by the Governor.
- 11 (c) In the event of any emergency situation in which the
- 12 General Assembly cannot act in sufficient time, the Governor is
- 13 authorized through executive authorization to provide up to
- 14 \$10,000,000 in Federal funds to alleviate the emergency
- 15 situation. For the purposes of this section, "emergency" is
- 16 defined as any situation in which there is a chance of or which
- 17 may result in substantial human suffering.
- 18 Section 1806. Transfer of funds from TANFBG to CCDFBG and
- 19 SSBG.--In accordance with Federal law which permits the transfer
- 20 of funds from the TANFBG to the CCDFBG and SSBG, the Department
- 21 of Public Welfare, upon approval of the Secretary of the Budget,
- 22 may make such transfers of funds provided that any such transfer
- 23 will not result in a deficit in any appropriation from which
- 24 funds are transferred. The Secretary of the Budget shall provide
- 25 ten days prior notification of any such transfers to the
- 26 chairman and the minority chairman of the Appropriations
- 27 Committee of the Senate and the chairman and minority chairman
- 28 of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

- 2 Section 1901. Prior laws unaffected. -- This act is not
- 3 intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal any provision of
- 4 any act enacted at this or any prior session of the General
- 5 Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the ordering of
- 6 printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and use of
- 7 automobiles, the method of making payments from the State
- 8 Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any
- 9 administrative department, board or commission.
- 10 Section 1902. Compliance with other law before funds
- 11 available. -- No appropriation made by this act to any department,
- 12 board, commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be
- 13 available unless and until the department, board, commission or
- 14 agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of
- 15 April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative
- 16 Code of 1929.
- 17 Section 1903. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or
- 18 committing funds. -- Funds available to agencies, boards,
- 19 departments, commissions or other governmental entities under
- 20 this act for the procurement of supplies, services or
- 21 construction shall not be available for payment of or to be
- 22 committed to or encumbered for payment of any such procurement
- 23 unless and until the agency, board, department or other
- 24 governmental entity has complied with all of the requirements
- 25 applicable to the procurement that are set out in 62 Pa.C.S.
- 26 (relating to procurement) and in the policies, procedures and
- 27 regulations instituted in accordance with that code.
- 28 Section 1904. Minority business set-asides.--(a) Each
- 29 department or other instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed
- 30 in Subpart A of Part II authorized to contract for buildings,

- 1 highways, commodities, equipment, supplies or services shall
- 2 report to the General Assembly all information pertinent to
- 3 anticipated procurement needs at the beginning of each fiscal
- 4 year and each fiscal quarter thereafter.
- 5 (b) As used in this section, the term "minority business"
- 6 means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of
- 7 July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the Pennsylvania
- 8 Minority Business Development Authority Act.
- 9 Section 1905. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous
- 10 sources. -- (a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this
- 11 act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies
- 12 furnished to employees and other persons, except inmates, by an
- 13 institution and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale
- 14 of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other
- 15 materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General
- 16 Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the
- 17 several respective institutions for the operation and
- 18 maintenance of the institutions.
- 19 (b) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all
- 20 moneys received from any other source, except the Federal
- 21 Government, as contributions for the programs provided herein or
- 22 as payment for services or materials furnished by one
- 23 institution to another, except those collections designated as
- 24 revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby
- 25 appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the
- 26 respective appropriations.
- 27 (c) In addition to any funds specifically appropriated by
- 28 this act, all moneys received by a department or agency of the
- 29 Commonwealth from any other sources, except the Federal
- 30 Government, as contributions or supplements to the department or

- 1 agency for a program or administration of an act included in
- 2 this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the
- 3 appropriation for that program or administration of the act.
- 4 Section 1906. Lapsing of unused funds. --
- 5 (a) Except as otherwise provided by law or by this section,
- 6 that part of all appropriations in Parts II, III, IV, V, VI,
- 7 VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, XIII, XIV, XV and XVI unexpended,
- 8 uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30, 2012, shall
- 9 automatically lapse as of that date.
- 10 (b) The appropriations in Part II to the Legislative
- 11 Department shall be continuing appropriations.
- 12 (c) The appropriation in Part II to the Supreme Court for
- 13 the unified judicial system security program shall be a
- 14 continuing appropriation.
- 15 Section 1907. Appellate courts appropriation contingency. --
- 16 The funds appropriated in Part II to the Supreme, Superior and
- 17 Commonwealth Courts for justice and judge expenses are
- 18 contingent upon a vouchered expense account plan being continued
- 19 by the Supreme Court.
- 20 Section 1908. Transfer of excess funds. -- The Governor may
- 21 transfer any excess money in those funds receiving proceeds of
- 22 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general obligation bonds in excess
- 23 of the amount necessary for the purposes for which the bonds
- 24 were issued to the appropriate sinking fund for payment of debt
- 25 service due on outstanding bonds. If such excess funds, together
- 26 with any available balance, exceed the amount of debt service
- 27 remaining to be paid, the funds shall be transferred to the
- 28 General Fund or to the appropriate special fund responsible for
- 29 such debt service.

- 2 Section 2001. Effective date. -- This act shall take effect as
- 3 follows:
- 4 (1) Part XVII shall take effect immediately.
- 5 (2) This section shall take effect immediately.

- 7 2011, or immediately, whichever is later.
