AN ACT

- 1 Establishing standards for preventing sudden cardiac arrest and
- death in student athletes; assigning duties to the Department
- of Health and the Department of Education; and imposing
- 4 penalties.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Sudden
- 9 Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 "Athletic activity." All of the following:
- 15 (1) Interscholastic athletics.

- 1 (2) An athletic contest or competition, other than
- 2 interscholastic athletics, that is sponsored by or associated
- 3 with a school entity, including cheerleading, club-sponsored
- 4 sports activities and sports activities sponsored by school-
- 5 affiliated organizations.
- 6 (3) Noncompetitive cheerleading that is sponsored by or
- 7 associated with a school entity.
- 8 (4) Practices, interschool practices and scrimmages for
- 9 all of the activities listed under paragraphs (1), (2) and
- 10 (3).
- "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- "Interscholastic athletics." As defined in section 1602-A of
- 13 the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public
- 14 School Code of 1949.
- "School entity." As defined in section 1602-A of the act of
- 16 March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code
- 17 of 1949.
- 18 Section 3. Sudden cardiac arrest.
- 19 (a) Educational materials.--
- 20 (1) The department and the Department of Education shall
- 21 develop and post on their publicly accessible Internet
- 22 websites guidelines and other relevant materials to inform
- and educate students participating in or desiring to
- 24 participate in an athletic activity, their parents and their
- coaches about the nature and warning signs of sudden cardiac
- arrest, including the risks associated with continuing to
- 27 play or practice after experiencing the following symptoms:
- ONE OR MORE SYMPTOMS OF SUDDEN CARDIAC ARREST, INCLUDING
- 29 fainting, difficulty breathing, chest pains, dizziness and
- 30 abnormal racing heart rate.

- 1 (2) In developing the guidelines and materials, the
- 2 department and the Department of Education may utilize
- 3 existing materials developed by organizations, such as Parent
- 4 Heart Watch and Sudden Arrhythmia Death Syndromes.
- 5 (3) A student participating in or desiring to
- 6 participate in an athletic activity and the student's parent
- or guardian shall, each school year and prior to
- 8 participation by the student in an athletic activity, sign
- 9 and return to the student's school an acknowledgment of
- 10 receipt and review of the A sudden cardiac arrest symptoms
- and warning sign SIGNS information sheet developed under this
- 12 subsection.
- 13 (b) Informational meeting. -- A school entity may hold an
- 14 informational meeting prior to the start of each athletic season
- 15 for all ages of competitors regarding the symptoms and warning
- 16 signs of sudden cardiac arrest. In addition to students,
- 17 parents, coaches and other school officials, informational
- 18 meetings may include physicians, pediatric cardiologists and
- 19 athletic trainers.
- 20 (c) Removal from play.--
- 21 (1) A student who, as determined by a game official,
- coach from the student's team, certified athletic trainer,
- licensed physician or other official designated by the
- student's school entity, exhibits signs or symptoms of sudden
- 25 cardiac arrest while participating in an athletic activity
- 26 shall be removed by the coach from participation at that
- time, SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (3).
- 28 (2) If a student is known to have exhibited signs or
- 29 symptoms of sudden cardiac arrest at any time prior to or
- 30 following an athletic activity, the student shall be

prevented from participating in an athletic activity, SUBJECT
TO PARAGRAPH (3).

(3) The student shall not return to participation in an athletic activity until the student is evaluated and cleared for return to participation in writing by a licensed physician or certified registered nurse practitioner or, if referred by a licensed physician or certified registered nurse practitioner to a cardiologist for evaluation, the written clearance is provided by the cardiologist.

- (3) A STUDENT REMOVED OR PREVENTED FROM PARTICIPATING IN

 AN ATHLETIC ACTIVITY UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OR (2) SHALL NOT

 RETURN TO PARTICIPATION UNTIL THE STUDENT IS EVALUATED AND

 CLEARED FOR RETURN TO PARTICIPATION IN WRITING BY A LICENSED

 PHYSICIAN, CERTIFIED REGISTERED NURSE PRACTITIONER OR

 CARDIOLOGIST.
- (4) In order to help determine whether a student is ready to return to play, the licensed physician or certified registered nurse practitioner may consult any other licensed or certified medical professionals.
- (d) Training course.--
- (1) Once each school year, a coach of an athletic activity shall complete the sudden cardiac arrest training course offered by a provider approved by the department.
- 24 (2) A coach of an athletic activity shall not coach the 25 athletic activity until the coach completes the training 26 course required under this subsection.
- 27 (e) Penalties.--The governing body of a school entity shall 28 establish the following minimum penalties for a coach found in 29 violation of the requirements under subsection (c), which 30 penalties shall take effect two years following the effective

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- 1 date of this section:
- 2 (1) For a first violation, suspension from coaching any
- 3 athletic activity for the remainder of the season.
- 4 (2) For a second violation, suspension from coaching any
- 5 athletic activity for the remainder of the season and for the
- 6 next season.
- 7 (3) For a third violation, permanent suspension from
- 8 coaching any athletic activity.
- 9 (f) Other youth athletic activities. -- The sponsors of youth
- 10 athletic activities NOT ASSOCIATED WITH A SCHOOL ENTITY are
- 11 encouraged to follow the guidance stated in this act.
- 12 (g) Construction. -- Nothing in this act shall be construed
- 13 to:
- 14 (1) abridge or limit any rights provided under a
- 15 collective bargaining agreement IN EFFECT ON THE EFFECTIVE
- DATE OF THIS SECTION or any rights provided under the act of
- 17 July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe
- 18 Relations Act; or
- 19 (2) create, establish, expand, reduce, contract or
- 20 eliminate any civil liability on the part of any school
- 21 entity or school employee.
- 22 Section 4. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
