13	GENERAL PROVISIONS
14	Section 101. Short title.
15	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Flood Control
16	and Disaster Mitigation Itemization Act of 2012.
17	CHAPTER 3
18	DISASTER CAPITAL BUDGET PROJECT ITEMIZATIONS
19	Section 301. Scope.

This chapter relates to disaster capital budget project
 itemizations in 2012.

3 Section 302. Construction of chapter.

For purposes of this act, the projects itemized in this chapter shall be considered public improvement projects under the provisions of the act of February 9, 1999 (P.L.1, No.1), known as the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act, for the purposes of the administration and procurement.

9 Section 303. Total authorization.

10 The total authorization for the capital projects in the 11 category of public improvement projects itemized in section 304 12 and to be constructed by the Department of General Services, its 13 successors or assigns and to be funded as specified in section 14 305.

15 Section 304. Itemization of public improvement projects.

23	The projects itemized in this chapter shall be funded from a
24	portion of existing interest earnings held by the Commonwealth
25	Financing Authority established under 64 Pa.C.S. Ch. 15
26	(relating to Commonwealth Financing Authority).
27	Section 306. Transfer and appropriations.
28	Notwithstanding the provisions of 64 Pa.C.S. Ch. 15 Subchs. B
29	(relating to structure and powers) and C (relating to bonds),
30	interest earnings held by the Commonwealth Financing Authority
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1 in an amount not exceeding \$6,171,000 shall be transferred to 2 the Capital Facilities Fund and appropriated to the Department 3 of General Services to be used by it exclusively to defray the 4 financial cost of the projects specifically itemized in this 5 chapter.

6 Section 307. Federal funds.

All moneys received from the Federal Government for the
projects specifically itemized in this chapter are also hereby
appropriated for those projects.

10 Section 308. Construction.

(a) Amounts contained in this chapter for any project shall not supplant or replace any Federal funds authorized by any Federal law or regulation. Funding from this chapter for any project is available only to the extent that Federal funds are not available for such project.

(b) Projects which are itemized in this chapter are deemed to be flood mitigation projects for purposes of and funding under Chapter 5 to the extent that the projects qualify under The Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (Public Law 93-288, 88 Stat. 143).

CHAPTER 5

22 DISASTER MITIGATION AND ASSISTANCE PROJECTS 23 Section 501. Scope.

This chapter relates to disaster mitigation and assistance projects itemization in 2012.

26 Section 502. Definitions.

The following words and phrases when used in this chapter shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

30 "Disaster." The period of time in calendar year 2011

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relating to Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee that was the
 subject of a Presidential declaration of an emergency under The
 Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act
 (Public Law 93-288, 88 Stat. 143).

5 Section 503. Total authorization.

6 The total authorization for disaster mitigation projects or public assistance projects as defined in The Robert T. Stafford 7 Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (Public Law 93-288, 8 88 Stat. 143) or as a project qualifying for assistance by the 9 10 United States Army Corps of Engineers and to be financed in part 11 with grants limited to the required match for the Federal share 12 of the costs made to local political subdivisions or nonprofit organizations where applicable as itemized in this chapter is 13 \$61,743,000 \$61,791,000. Projects for which no Federal funds are 14 received shall not receive funding under this chapter. 15

28	Section 514. State and local participation levels.			
29	(a) Public assistanceThe required non-Federal			
30	contribution of 25% or 20%, as appropriate, necessary to secure			
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Federal public assistance funding shall be divided between the
 State and the affected local political subdivision or nonprofit
 organization where applicable. The State share shall not exceed
 22% of the total cost of the projects.

(b) Local waiver.--The Commonwealth may reduce the share of 5 an affected political subdivision if the tax base of that 6 political subdivision was substantially reduced as a direct 7 result of Hurricane Irene or Tropical Storm Lee or if payment of 8 the local share exceeds 40% of the most recently adopted annual 9 10 budget of the political subdivision. The Commonwealth may require the adoption of appropriate flood control or storm water 11 management plans as a condition of the waiver if the adoption of 12 the plan does not present additional financial hardship. 13

14 Section 515. Federal funds.

All moneys received from the Federal Government for the projects specifically itemized in this chapter are also hereby appropriated for those projects.

18 Section 516. State funds.

19 The State share of funding for projects itemized in this 20 chapter shall be funded from a portion of existing interest 21 earnings held by the Commonwealth Financing Authority 22 established under 64 Pa.C.S. Ch. 15 (relating to Commonwealth 23 Financing Authority).

24 Section 517. Transfer and appropriation.

Notwithstanding the provisions of 64 Pa.C.S. Ch. 15, Subchs. R (relating to structure and powers) and C (relating to bonds), interest earnings held by the Commonwealth Financing Authority in an amount not exceeding \$15,500,000 \$15,548,000 shall be transferred to the Capital Facilities Fund and appropriated to the Department of Environmental Protection to be used by it

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exclusively to defray the financial cost of the projects 1 specifically itemized in this chapter. 2 Section 518. Construction. 3 4 Amounts contained in this chapter for any project shall not supplant or replace any Federal funds authorized by any Federal 5 law or regulation. Funding from this chapter for any project is 6 available only to the extent that Federal funds are not 7 available for such project. 8 9 CHAPTER 7 10 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS 11 Section 701. Constitutional construction. The provisions of this act shall be severable and, if any of 12 the provisions of this act shall be held unconstitutional, such 13 decisions shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining 14 provisions of this act. It is hereby declared as the legislative 15 16 intent that this act would have been adopted had such 17 unconstitutional provisions not been included in this act.

18 Section 702. Effective date.

19 This act shall take effect immediately.
