## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the members of Boy Scout Troop 313 of Audubon,
- 2 Montgomery County, for their heroic efforts in saving a man's
- life and providing assistance to their fellow scouts in a
- 4 time of great need.
- 5 WHEREAS, On June 16, 2012, a troop leader of Boy Scout Troop
- 6 538, located in Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, experienced a serious
- 7 accident while hiking at Ricketts Glen State Park; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The troop leader fell nearly 40 feet into a rocky
- 9 ravine while leading members of Troop 538 on a hike; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Members of Troop 538 immediately began to climb down
- 11 into the ravine to administer first aid to their troop leader;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, Members of Troop 313 of Audubon arrived at the scene
- 14 at nearly the same time, as they, too, were hiking the trail;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, The two troops quickly decided that Troop 313 should

- 1 take over the administration of first aid, while the victim's
- 2 son, an Eagle Scout, and other members of Troop 538, rushed to a
- 3 park ranger's station to seek help and arrange for a wilderness
- 4 rescue; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Members of Troop 313 kept the victim immobile and
- 6 calm for nearly three hours while waiting for emergency
- 7 personnel to arrive; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Members of Troop 313 also assisted in the emergency
- 9 ravine extraction and, upon reaching the top of the ravine,
- 10 assisted in carrying the injured individual to an awaiting ATV
- 11 for transport; and
- 12 WHEREAS, One scout remained with the victim and emergency
- 13 personnel, continuing to provide support and first aid to the
- 14 victim until he was airlifted to a hospital for further
- 15 treatment; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The victim endured several life-threatening injuries
- 17 and later recalled that all scouts present were calm, reassuring
- 18 and highly competent in the administration of first aid; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Both troops exhibited exemplary communication,
- 20 organization and leadership skills; therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 22 members of Boy Scout Troop 313 for their heroic efforts in
- 23 saving a man's life and providing assistance to their fellow
- 24 scouts in a time of great need.
