AN ACT

- Amending Title 62 (Procurement) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for contracting with veteran-owned small
- businesses; and imposing duties on the Department of General
- Services and other Commonwealth purchasing agencies.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 62 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 3 § 2201. Definitions.
- 4 Subject to section 2202 (relating to regulations), the
- 5 <u>following words and phrases when used in this chapter shall have</u>
- 6 the meanings given to them in this section unless the context
- 7 <u>clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 8 <u>"Service disabled." A veteran who possesses either a</u>
- 9 <u>disability rating letter issued by the United States Department</u>
- 10 of Veterans Affairs or a disability determination from the
- 11 <u>United States Department of Defense.</u>
- "Service-disabled veteran-owned SMALL business." A small_
- 13 <u>business owned and controlled by a service-disabled veteran or</u>
- 14 <u>veterans or, if approved by the Department of General Services,</u>
- 15 a surviving spouse or permanent caregiver of a service-disabled
- 16 veteran.
- 17 "Small business." A business that does not exceed the
- 18 limitation on revenue or number of employees established by the
- 19 Department of General Services for designation as a small
- 20 business.
- 21 "Veteran." A person who served on active duty in the United
- 22 States Armed Forces, including any of the following:
- 23 (1) A reservist or member of the National Guard who was
- 24 <u>discharged or released from the service under honorable</u>
- 25 conditions.
- 26 (2) A reservist or member of the National Guard who
- 27 <u>completed an initial term of enlistment or qualifying period</u>
- 28 of service.
- 29 (3) A reservist or member of the National Guard who was
- 30 disabled in the line of duty during training.

- 1 "Veteran-owned small business." A SMALL business owned and
- 2 <u>controlled by a veteran or veterans.</u>
- 3 § 2202. Regulations.
- 4 The department shall establish policy in accordance with this
- 5 chapter for executive agencies and independent agencies and may
- 6 promulgate regulations establishing detailed definitions of the
- 7 words and phrases defined in section 2201 (relating to
- 8 <u>definitions</u>) using, in addition to the criteria set forth in
- 9 section 2201, other criteria as it deems appropriate, including
- 10 the number of employees and the dollar volume of business.
- 11 State-affiliated entities shall implement the policy for their
- 12 procurement programs.
- 13 § 2203. Veteran-owned small business participation goals.
- 14 <u>Each purchasing agency shall have an annual goal of not less</u>
- 15 than 5% participation by veteran-owned small businesses in all
- 16 contracts entered into by the purchasing agency. The
- 17 participation goal shall apply to the overall dollar amount
- 18 expended by the purchasing agency with respect to the contracts.
- 19 § 2204. Duties of department.
- The department shall have the following duties:
- 21 (1) Where feasible, provide appropriate staff who shall
- 22 be responsible to the department and who shall serve within
- 23 designated Commonwealth agencies to assist veteran-owned
- 24 small businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned small
- businesses in this Commonwealth in learning how to do
- 26 <u>business with Commonwealth agencies.</u>
- 27 (2) Give special publicity to procurement procedures and
- issue special publications designed to assist veteran-owned
- 29 small businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned small
- 30 businesses in learning how to do business with Commonwealth

- 2 (3) Compile, maintain and make available source lists of

 3 veteran-owned small businesses and service-disabled

 4 veteran-owned small businesses for the purpose of encouraging

 5 procurement from veteran-owned small businesses.
- 6 (4) Include veteran-owned small businesses and
 7 service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses on
 8 solicitation mailing lists.
- 9 <u>(5) Assure that veteran-owned small businesses and</u>
 10 <u>service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses are solicited</u>
 11 on each procurement for which the businesses may be suited.
- 12 (6) Develop special training programs to assist veteran13 owned small businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned
 14 small businesses in learning how to do business with
 15 Commonwealth agencies.
- 16 (7) Assure that participation by veteran-owned small

 17 businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned small

 18 businesses is appropriately factored into the evaluation of

 19 proposals for supplies, services or construction when a

 20 purchasing agency uses the competitive sealed proposals

 21 method under section 513 (relating to competitive sealed

 22 proposals).
- 23 (8) Certify businesses that have been identified as

 24 veteran-owned small businesses and service-disabled

 25 veteran-owned small businesses.
- 26 § 2205. Bonding and progress payments.
- 27 (a) Bonding. -- Notwithstanding other provisions of this part:
- 28 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), a purchasing
- 29 <u>agency may reduce the level or change the types of bonding</u>
- 30 <u>normally required or accept alternative forms of security to</u>

- 1 the extent reasonably necessary to encourage procurement from
- veteran-owned small businesses and service-disabled
- 3 veteran-owned small businesses.
- 4 (2) For contracts under \$50,000, veteran-owned small
- 5 <u>businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned small</u>
- 6 <u>businesses shall be exempt from any bonding requirements.</u>
- 7 (b) Progress payments. -- A purchasing agency may make special
- 8 provisions for progress payments as it deems reasonably
- 9 necessary to encourage procurement from veteran-owned small
- 10 businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses.
- 11 § 2206. (Reserved).
- 12 <u>§ 2207.</u> Reports.
- 13 (a) Report to Department of General Services. -- By August 15,
- 14 2013, and each August 15 thereafter, each executive and
- 15 <u>independent agency shall submit an annual report for the period</u>
- 16 of July 1 to June 30 to the Department of General Services on
- 17 actual utilization of veteran-owned small businesses and
- 18 service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses as contractors,
- 19 subcontractors, suppliers and professional service providers.
- 20 (b) Report to standing committees. -- The department and each
- 21 State-affiliated entity shall annually, before October 1, report
- 22 in writing to the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness
- 23 Committee of the Senate and the Veterans Affairs and Emergency
- 24 Preparedness Committee of the House of Representatives
- 25 concerning total contract dollars awarded to veteran-owned small
- 26 businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses
- 27 by the purchasing agency during the preceding fiscal year. The
- 28 report shall include a list of all veteran-owned small
- 29 businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses
- 30 that participated as contractors, subcontractors or suppliers

- 1 during the preceding fiscal year. The department and State-
- 2 <u>affiliated entity initial reports shall be submitted to the</u>
- 3 standing committees under this section on or before October 1,
- 4 2011 2012, or on or before October 1 at least 12 months after
- 5 the effective date of this section, whichever is later.
- 6 § 2208. Compliance with Federal requirements.
- 7 If a procurement involves the expenditure of Federal
- 8 <u>assistance or contract funds</u>, the purchasing agency shall comply
- 9 with Federal law and authorized regulations that are mandatorily
- 10 applicable and that are not presently reflected in this part.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
