- 10 "Service disabled." A veteran who possesses either a

- 14 "Service disabled veteran owned small business." A small
- 15 business owned and controlled by a service-disabled veteran or
- 16 veterans or, if approved by the Department of General Services,
- 17 a surviving spouse or permanent caregiver of a service disabled

- 19 "Small business." A business that does not exceed the
- 20 limitation on revenue or number of employees established by the
- 21 <u>Department of General Services for designation as a small</u>
- 22 <del>business.</del>
- 23 "Veteran." A person who served on active duty in the United
- 24 States Armed Forces, including any of the following:
- 25 (1) A reservist or member of the National Guard who was
- 26 discharged or released from the service under honorable
- 27 conditions.
- 28 (2) A reservist or member of the National Guard who
- 29 <u>completed an initial term of enlistment or qualifying period</u>
- 30 of service.

1	(3) A reservist or member of the National Guard who was
2	disabled in the line of duty during training.
3	"Veteran owned small business." A small business owned and
4	controlled by a veteran or veterans.
5	§ 2202. Regulations.
6	The department shall establish policy in accordance with this
7	chapter for executive agencies and independent agencies and may
8	promulgate regulations establishing detailed definitions of the
9	words and phrases defined in section 2201 (relating to
10	definitions) using, in addition to the criteria set forth in
11	section 2201, other criteria as it deems appropriate, including
12	the number of employees and the dollar volume of business.
13	State-affiliated entities shall implement the policy for their
14	procurement programs.
15	§ 2203. Veteran-owned small business participation goals.
16	Each purchasing agency shall have an annual goal of not less
17	than 5% participation by veteran-owned small businesses in all
18	contracts entered into by the purchasing agency. The
19	participation goal shall apply to the overall dollar amount
20	expended by the purchasing agency with respect to the contracts.
21	§ 2204. Duties of department.
22	The department shall have the following duties:
23	(1) Where feasible, provide appropriate staff who shall
24	be responsible to the department and who shall serve within
25	designated Commonwealth agencies to assist veteran-owned
26	small businesses and service disabled veteran owned small_
27	businesses in this Commonwealth in learning how to do
28	business with Commonwealth agencies.
29	(2) Give special publicity to procurement procedures and

10	solicitation mailing lists.

14	(6) Develop special training programs to assist veteran
15	owned small businesses and service disabled veteran owned
16	small businesses in learning how to do business with
17	Commonwealth agencies.
18	(7) Assure that participation by veteran owned small
19	businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned small_
20	businesses is appropriately factored into the evaluation of
21	proposals for supplies, services or construction when a
22	purchasing agency uses the competitive sealed proposals
23	method under section 513 (relating to competitive sealed
24	<del>proposals).</del>
25	(8) Certify businesses that have been identified as
26	<u>veteran owned small businesses and service disabled</u>
27	<u>veteran-owned small businesses.</u>
28	§ 2205. Bonding and progress payments.
29	(a) Bonding Notwithstanding other provisions of this part:
30	(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), a purchasing

2	normally required or accept alternative forms of security to
3	the extent reasonably necessary to encourage procurement from
4	veteran owned small businesses and service disabled
5	veteran-owned small businesses.
6	(2) For contracts under \$50,000, veteran owned small
7	businesses and service-disabled veteran-owned small_
8	businesses shall be exempt from any bonding requirements.
9	(b) Progress payments. A purchasing agency may make special
10	provisions for progress payments as it deems reasonably
11	necessary to encourage procurement from veteran owned small
12	businesses and service-disabled veteran owned small businesses.

15	(a) Report to Department of General ServicesBy August 15,
16	2013, and each August 15 thereafter, each executive and
17	independent agency shall submit an annual report for the period

20	service disabled veteran owned small businesses as contractors,
21	subcontractors, suppliers and professional service providers.
22	(b) Report to standing committees. The department and each
23	State-affiliated entity shall annually, before October 1, report
24	in writing to the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness
25	Committee of the Senate and the Veterans Affairs and Emergency
26	Preparedness Committee of the House of Representatives
27	concerning total contract dollars awarded to veteran owned small
28	businesses and service disabled veteran owned small businesses
29	by the purchasing agency during the preceding fiscal year. The
30	report shall include a list of all veteran owned small

- 10 WITH FEDERAL LAW AND AUTHORIZED REGULATIONS THAT ARE MANDATORILY

- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
