- Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and 1 Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, providing for the definition of "commercial sex"; further providing for trafficking of persons and for prostitution and related offenses; and providing for motion 5 to vacate conviction for prostitution. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 3001 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 10 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a definition to read: 11 § 3001. Definitions. 12 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter 13 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 14 context clearly indicates otherwise: 15 "Commercial sex." Commercial sex acts, including conduct that constitutes an offense under section 5902 (relating to 16

prostitution and related offenses), that are performed or

- 19 (1) by a person under 18 years of age; or
- 20 (2) by a person 18 years of age or over who performs the

- 1 <u>acts because another person:</u>
- 2 (i) attempts to cause, causes or by threat of
- 3 physical menace puts the person performing the acts in
- 4 <u>fear of bodily injury;</u>
- 5 <u>(ii) physically restrains or threatens to physically</u>
- 6 restrain the person performing the acts unlawfully;
- 7 <u>(iii) abuses or threatens to abuse the law or legal</u>
- 8 <u>process;</u>
- 9 <u>(iv) possesses except as required under Federal</u>
- immigration law or regulation, destroys, conceals,
- 11 removes or confiscates any actual or purported passport
- or other immigration document of the person performing
- the acts, or any other actual or purported government
- identification document of the person performing the
- acts; or
- 16 (v) engages in criminal coercion of the person
- 17 performing the acts.

- 19 Section 2. Section 3002(a) of Title 18 is amended to read:
- 20 § 3002. Trafficking of persons.
- 21 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits an offense if the
- 22 person knowingly traffics or knowingly attempts to traffic
- 23 another person, knowing that the other person will be subjected
- 24 to forced labor or services or commercial sex.

- 26 Section 3. Section 5902 of Title 18 is amended by adding a
- 27 subsection to read:
- 28 § 5902. Prostitution and related offenses.

- 30 <u>(a.2) Victim of sex trafficking.--A person shall not be</u>

- 1 <u>quilty of prostitution under subsection (a) if the person's</u>
- 2 participation in the offense was a result of having been a
- 3 victim of trafficking for commercial sex under section 3002(a)
- 4 (relating to trafficking of persons) or trafficking in persons
- 5 under the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (22 U.S.C.
- 6 § 7101 et seq.). Official documentation of the person's status
- 7 <u>as a victim of sex trafficking or trafficking in persons at the</u>
- 8 time of the offense from a Federal, State or local government
- 9 agency or a victim services agency or organization shall create
- 10 a presumption that the person's participation in the offense was
- 11 <u>a result of having been a victim of sex trafficking or</u>
- 12 <u>trafficking in persons.</u>

- 14 Section 4. Title 42 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 15 § 9502. Motion to vacate conviction for prostitution.
- 16 (a) Procedure. -- At any time after the entry of a judgment,
- 17 the court in which it was entered may, upon motion of the
- 18 <u>defendant</u>, vacate the judgment upon the ground that the
- 19 defendant's conviction was under 18 Pa.C.S. § 5902 (relating to
- 20 prostitution and related offenses) and participation in the
- 21 offense was a result of having been a victim of trafficking for
- 22 commercial sex under 18 Pa.C.S. § 3002(a) (relating to
- 23 trafficking of persons) or trafficking in persons under the
- 24 Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (22 U.S.C. § 7101 et
- 25 seq.).
- 26 (b) Requirements. -- A motion under this section shall be made
- 27 with due diligence, after the defendant has ceased to be a
- 28 victim of the trafficking or has sought services for victims of
- 29 the trafficking, subject to reasonable concerns for the safety
- 30 of the defendant, family members of the defendant or other

- 1 <u>victims of the trafficking that may be jeopardized by the</u>
- 2 bringing of the motion, or for other reasons consistent with the
- 3 purpose of this section. Official documentation of the
- 4 <u>defendant's status as a victim of sex trafficking or trafficking</u>
- 5 <u>in persons at the time of the offense from a Federal, State or</u>
- 6 <u>local government agency or a victim services agency or</u>
- 7 organization shall create a presumption that the defendant's
- 8 participation in the offense was a result of having been a
- 9 <u>victim of sex trafficking or trafficking in persons, but shall</u>
- 10 not be required for granting a motion under this section.
- 11 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
