AN ACT

Selecting, designating and adopting the timber rattlesnake as the official reptile of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake is one of three venomous snakes that occur in Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake lives primarily in mountainous areas of the State, above 1,800 feet in elevation; and

WHEREAS, The scientific name for the timber rattlesnake is Crotalus horridus; and

WHEREAS, Crotalus horridus ranges from southern New Hampshire to northern Florida and from New Jersey as far west as eastern Texas and Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake can be found in numerous counties in this Commonwealth, primarily in the central and northeastern regions of the state; and

WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake is currently vulnerable to a decline in population due to a number of factors, including habitat loss; and

WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake is legally protected in
Pennsylvania and is subject to hunting and possession
regulations; and
WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake is large in length, up to 74 inches, and stout-bodied, and its coloring consists of brown or black bands on bright yellow to black body coloration; and WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake is a reptile that inspires both fear and fascination among many Pennsylvanians.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Designation of the official reptile of the Commonwealth.

The timber rattlesnake or Crotalus horridus is selected, designated and adopted as the official reptile of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Section 2. Effective date.

This act shall take effect immediately.
