AN ACT

- 1 Selecting, designating and adopting the timber rattlesnake as 2 the official reptile of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake is one of three venomous
- 4 snakes that occur in Pennsylvania; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake lives primarily in
- 6 mountainous areas of the State, above 1,800 feet in elevation;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, The scientific name for the timber rattlesnake is
- 9 Crotalus horridus; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Crotalus horridus ranges from southern New Hampshire
- 11 to northern Florida and from New Jersey as far west as eastern
- 12 Texas and Minnesota; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake can be found in numerous
- 14 counties in this Commonwealth, primarily in the central and
- 15 northeastern regions of the State; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake is currently vulnerable to a
- 17 decline in population due to a number of factors, including
- 18 habitat loss; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake is legally protected in
- 2 Pennsylvania and is subject to hunting and possession
- 3 regulations; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake is large in length, up to 74
- 5 inches, and stout-bodied, and its coloring consists of brown or
- 6 black bands on bright yellow to black body coloration; and
- WHEREAS, The timber rattlesnake is a reptile that inspires
- 8 both fear and fascination among many Pennsylvanians.
- 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 10 hereby enacts as follows:
- 11 Section 1. Designation of the official reptile of the
- 12 Commonwealth.
- 13 The timber rattlesnake or Crotalus horridus is selected,
- 14 designated and adopted as the official reptile of the
- 15 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 16 Section 2. Effective date.
- 17 This act shall take effect immediately.
