AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 1 2 Executive and Judicial Departments and the State Government 3 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 4 fiscal year July 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, for certain 5 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 6 7 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012; to provide appropriations from the 8 State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation 9 Restricted Revenue Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the 10 11 Home Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 12 Operating Fund, the Tuition Payment Fund, the Banking 13 Department Fund, the Firearm Records Check Fund, the Ben 14 Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, the Oil and 15 16 Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account and the Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act 17 18 Enforcement Fund, to the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation 19 Account to the Judicial Department for the fiscal year July 20 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013; to provide appropriations from the 21 Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 2012, to June 22 23 30, 2013, for the proper operation of several departments of the Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized 24 25 to spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the 26 appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of 27 the Commonwealth and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012; 28 29 to provide for the additional appropriation of Federal and State funds from the General Fund for the Executive and 30 31 Legislative Departments of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, and for the payment of 32 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the 33 fiscal year ending June 30, 2012, and to provide 34 appropriations from the Motor License Fund, the Home 35

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1 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding 2 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, 3 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and 4 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and 5 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, 6 7 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, 8 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on 9 10 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of 11 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment 12 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on 13 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee 14 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth 15 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation 16 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or 17 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental 18 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of 19 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of 20 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred 21 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall 22 23 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State 24 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside 25 hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution 26 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State 27 medical assistance program.

Section 104. State appropriations.--(a) General Fund.--The 5 6 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 7 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 8 General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 9 10 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 11 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or 12 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 13 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 14 purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public 15 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and 16 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by 17 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 18 19 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 20 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 21 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

22 (b) State Lottery Fund.--The following sums set forth in 23 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 24 specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the 25 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department 26 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 27 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 28 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 29 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 30 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as

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1 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 2 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 3 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 4 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 5 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

6 Tobacco Settlement Fund.--The following sums set forth (C) 7 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 8 specifically appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund to 9 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of 10 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 11 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 12 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 13 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 14 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 15 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 16 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 17 18 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 19 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

20 Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account. -- The (d) following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 21 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 22 23 restricted receipt account established within the General Fund, 24 known as the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account, to 25 the Judicial Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses, for 26 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 27 28 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 29 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 30

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and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year
 beginning July 1, 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred
 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June
 30, 2012.

(e) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.--The 5 6 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 7 Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several 8 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 9 10 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services 11 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and 12 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, 13 14 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set 15 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, and for the 16 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of 17 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

18 (f) The State Stores Fund. -- The following sums set forth in 19 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 20 specifically appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the hereinafter named agency of the Executive Department of the 21 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 22 23 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 24 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 25 26 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 27 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 28 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 29 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 30 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid

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1 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

2 (q) Motor License Fund. -- The following sums, or as much 3 thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the 4 Executive Department for the payment of salaries, wages and 5 other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or 6 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for 7 8 contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes 9 10 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 11 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012. 12

13 (h) Aviation Restricted Revenue Account. -- The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 14 15 appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the 16 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department for the purposes set forth herein for the 17 18 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, and for the payment of bills 19 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 20 ending June 30, 2012.

(i) Hazardous Material Response Fund.--The following sums 21 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, 22 23 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Hazardous Material 24 Response Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the 25 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 26 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 27 28 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 29 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 30

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2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

3 (j) Milk Marketing Fund. -- The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 4 specifically appropriated from the Milk Marketing Fund to the 5 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department 6 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 7 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 8 9 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 10 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 11 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 12 13 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 14 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 15 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 16 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

17 (k) Home Investment Trust Fund. -- The following sums set 18 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 19 hereby specifically appropriated from the Home Investment Trust 20 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, 21 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 22 23 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 24 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 25 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 26 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 27 28 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 29 beginning July 1, 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred 30 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June

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1 30, 2012.

2 (1) Tuition Payment Fund.--The following sums set forth in 3 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Tuition Payment Fund to the 4 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 5 6 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 7 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 8 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 9 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 10 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 11 12 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 13 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 14 15 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

16 Banking and Securities Department Fund. -- The following (m) sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be 17 18 necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Banking 19 and Securities Department Fund to the hereinafter named agencies 20 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment 21 of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, 22 23 for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for 24 the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, 25 26 necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the 27 28 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, and for the payment of bills 29 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012. 30

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1 Firearm Records Check Fund.--The following sums set (n) 2 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 3 hereby specifically appropriated from the Firearm Records Check Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 4 5 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 6 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 7 8 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 9 10 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 11 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 12 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 13 beginning July 1, 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred 14 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012. 15

16 (o) Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund. -- The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 17 18 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Ben 19 Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund to the 20 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 21 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 22 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 23 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 24 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 25 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 26 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 27 28 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 29 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012. 30

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1 (p) Oil and Gas Lease Fund.--The following sums set forth in 2 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 3 specifically appropriated from the Oil and Gas Lease Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 4 5 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 6 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 7 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 8 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 9 10 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 11 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 12 13 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012. 14

15 (q) Home Improvement Account. -- The following sums set forth 16 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 17 specifically appropriated from the Home Improvement Account to 18 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of 19 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 20 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 21 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 22 23 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 24 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 25 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 26 2012, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 27 28 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

(r) Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection ActBut Solution Solutio

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as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically 1 2 appropriated from the Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter 3 Protection Act Enforcement Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the 4 payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel 5 6 expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the 7 Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services 8 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this 9 10 act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions 11 and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for 12 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, and for the payment of 13 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal 14 year ending June 30, 2012.

15 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.--The 16 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 17 18 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to 19 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 20 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses 21 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, and for the payment of 22 23 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal 24 year ending June 30, 2012. Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal 25 26 year.

27 Section 106. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The 28 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 29 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 30 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies

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of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes
 and under the restrictions for which the funds are provided for
 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012.

(b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small
Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
cities and communities that have a high concentration of
impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet
community development needs.

10 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and 11 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on 12 13 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the 14 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In 15 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old 16 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to 17 18 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

(d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is for the provision of preventive health and other health services related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants, comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic violence services.

(e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The
Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in
planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for
pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with

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special health care needs and in providing health services for
 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health
 care.

4 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low5 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help
6 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income
7 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for
8 low-income dwellings. Up to 15% of the LIHEABG funds received
9 may be used for weatherization.

10 (g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block 11 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible 12 persons.

13 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health 14 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of 15 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with 16 serious emotional disturbance.

(i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block
Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

(j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and availability of child care for low-income families.

(k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.-The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG)
provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care,
training and support services, child welfare and administration
for eligible families and individuals.

Minority business set-asides.--(a) Each department or other instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed in Subpart B or C authorized to contract for buildings, highways, commodities, equipment, supplies or services shall report to the General Assembly all information pertinent to anticipated procurement needs at the beginning of each fiscal year and each fiscal quarter thereafter.

(b) As used in this section, the term "minority business" means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.

Section 1955. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous sources.--(a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this part, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except inmates, by an institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale

Section 1957. Construction with prior appropriation acts.--Any appropriation in Subpart B or C of this part which is the same or similar to any appropriation in the act of June 30, 2011 (P.L.???, No.1A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 2011, shall replace that appropriation.

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1 Section 1958. Deduction of expended appropriations under 2 prior law. -- Any money which has been appropriated and expended 3 under the act of June 30, 2011 (P.L.????, No.1A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 2011, shall be deducted from the 4 5 corresponding appropriation in this part. 6 PART XX SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR FEDERAL FUNDS 7 8 FOR 2012-2013 Section 2001. General Fund repository for Federal funds.--9 10 All moneys received from the Federal Government as contributions 11 or supplements to the departments or agencies of the 12 Commonwealth or the programs herein provided shall be paid into 13 the General Fund. 14 Section 2002. Limitation on encumbering or spending Federal 15 funds.--Federal funds shall be encumbered or spent only to the 16 extent that such funds are estimated as being available during 17 the fiscal year of the Commonwealth. 18 Section 2003. Appropriation of prior unspent Federal 19 funds.--(a) Any Federal money which has been previously 20 appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized or allocated by the Federal Government but remains unspent from prior fiscal 21 years and will not be renewed for fiscal year 2012-2013 is 22 23 hereby appropriated. 24 The Federal appropriations to the Department of Public (b) 25 Welfare include any prior earnings that may be received during 26 fiscal year 2012-2013. Section 2004. Subgrants between Federal fund 4 5 appropriations.--Subgrants may be made between Federal 6 appropriations without further approval of the General Assembly. 7 The Secretary of the Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to the chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations 8 Committee of the Senate and the chairman and minority chairman 9 10 of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made 11 12 from a restricted receipt account without a specific 13 appropriation by the General Assembly.

Section 2005. Utilization of emergency Federal funds.--(a) Federal funds available for costs and damages resulting from natural disasters or civil disobedience may be added to an appropriation contained in this act or to funds appropriated or may be used for the purposes prescribed by the Federal Government.

20 (b) In addition to the moneys appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the purpose of 21 disaster assistance or relief, or other moneys received as a 22 23 direct result of terrorist acts, moneys for homeland security 24 and defense and moneys for avian flu/pandemic preparedness shall 25 be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of 26 the General Fund to the departments, boards, commissions or agencies designated by the Governor. 27

(c) In the event of any emergency situation in which the
General Assembly cannot act in sufficient time, the Governor is
authorized through executive authorization to provide up to

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\$10,000,000 in Federal funds to alleviate the emergency situation. For the purposes of this section, "emergency" is defined as any situation in which there is a chance of or which may result in substantial human suffering.

5 Section 2006. Transfer of funds from TANFBG to CCDFBG and 6 SSBG.--In accordance with Federal law which permits the transfer 7 of funds from the TANFBG to the CCDFBG and SSBG, the Department 8 of Public Welfare, upon approval of the Secretary of the Budget, may make such transfers of funds provided that any such transfer 9 10 will not result in a deficit in any appropriation from which 11 funds are transferred. The Secretary of the Budget shall provide 12 ten days prior notification of any such transfers to the 13 chairman and the minority chairman of the Appropriations 14 Committee of the Senate and the chairman and minority chairman 15 of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.
