## AN ACT

Amending the act of December 19, 1990 (P.L.1200, No.202), entitled "An act providing for the registration and regulation of solicitations by charitable organizations, 3 professional fundraisers and other solicitors; imposing 4 additional powers on the Department of State and the Office of Attorney General; prescribing civil and criminal penalties; and making a repeal, "further providing for 7 registration of charitable organizations, financial reports, 8 fees and failure to file. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. Section 5(a) of the act of December 19, 1990 13 (P.L.1200, No.202), known as the Solicitation of Funds for 14 Charitable Purposes Act, is amended to read: 15 Section 5. Registration of charitable organizations; financial 16 reports; fees; failure to file. 17 Registration and approval required. -- A charitable

organization, unless exempted from registration requirements

pursuant to section 6, shall file a registration statement with

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- 1 the department. This statement must be refiled annually [within
- 2 135 days after] by the fifteenth day of the fifth month
- 3 <u>following</u> the close of its fiscal year in which the charitable
- 4 organization was engaged in solicitation activities. The
- 5 department shall review the statement pursuant to subsection
- 6 (r). No charitable organization shall solicit contributions or
- 7 have contributions solicited in its behalf before approval of
- 8 its registration statement by the department.

- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
