AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the offense of trafficking of persons.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 3002 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
§ 3002. Trafficking of persons.
(a) Offense defined.--A person commits an offense if the person [knowingly]:
(1) knowingly traffics or knowingly attempts to traffic another person, knowing that the other person will be subjected to forced labor or services[.]; or

## (2) for the purpose of financial gain, intentionally

 traffics another person with knowledge or reason to know that the other person:            (i) is not a citizen of the United States; and
            (ii) cannot produce Federal documentation pertaining
        to presence in the United States.
    (b) Grading.--[An]
        (1) Except as set forth in paragraph (2):
            (i) An offense under subsection [(a)] (a) (1) shall
        be graded a felony of the second degree [unless].
            (ii) An offense under subsection (a) (2) shall be
        graded a felony of the third degree.
        (2) If the other person suffers bodily injury or the
        other person is an individual under 18 years of age, [in
        which case it] an offense under subsection (a) shall be
        graded as a felony of the first degree.
        Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
