19	Section 1. Sections 1333(b.1) and 1341 of Title 75 of the
20	Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
21	§ 1333. Lost, stolen, damaged or illegible registration plate.

1 (b.1) Illegible registration plate.--The department may 2 reissue a registration plate upon request by a registrant when 3 it is determined by an authorized representative of the department or law enforcement that the registration plate is 4 illegible from a reasonable distance. The department may select 5 the style of the reissued registration plate and, except in the 6 7 case of personal registration plates issued under section 1341 8 (relating to special registration plates [generally]), the registration plate number. 9

11 § 1341. Special registration plates [generally].

12 (a) General rule.--Upon request by the applicant, the department may issue registration plates consisting of any 13 14 combination of numbers, letters or numbers and letters. [These 15 special plates may be issued for special groups or for special 16 purposes and bear an appropriate designation. Special groups may 17 charge a fee for authorization to request a registration plate 18 bearing the name of the group.] They shall have the same force 19 and effect as regular registration plates. The department may 20 refuse any combination of letters and numbers for cause and 21 shall adopt reasonable rules and regulations for the issuance of the plates and for carrying out the provisions of this section. 22 23 The applicant shall comply with all laws and regulations 24 pertaining to registration including the payment of any 25 additional fees.

(b) Personal registration plates.--Upon request by the applicant, the department is authorized to issue personal registration plates. The department is authorized to reissue a combination of numbers or letters for a personal plate if the department records reveal that no activity, such as renewal or

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transfer of the personal registration plate, has occurred for a 1 2 period of five or more consecutive years and provided that the 3 personal registration plate was never reported as lost or stolen. Whenever the department reissues an inactive personal 4 5 plate, the department may purge its records of all references to the previous owners of that personal plate. The department 6 shall, however, note upon its records the reissuance of the 7 8 personal plate and to whom the plate was issued. [The special]  $\underline{A}$ 9 personal registration plate may be used only on a passenger car 10 {or}, motorcycle, truck, with a registered gross weight of not <--more than [10,000] 14,000 pounds, MOTORCYCLE, trailer or motor 11 <---12 home.

(c) Organization registration plates. -- Upon request by the 13 14 applicant, the department is authorized to issue organization registration plates. Organization registration plates may be 15 16 issued for special groups or for special purposes and bear an appropriate designation. Special groups may charge a fee for 17 18 authorization to request a registration plate bearing the name 19 of the group. If the vehicle is licensed to a business that is 20 not a member of the special group, the department shall issue the plate as long as the business owner or officer making 21 application is a member of that group. An organization 22 23 registration plate may be used only on a passenger car or truck 24 with a registered gross weight of not more than 14,000 pounds, <--TRAILER or a motor home. 25 26 Section 2. 12	(a) General ruleThe department, in consultation with the		
13	Appalachian Trail Conservancy, shall design a special		
14	Appalachian Trail organization registration plate. The plate, at		
15	a minimum, shall contain the image of a hiker and the		
16	Appalachian Trail Conservancy logo and distinctive coloring.		
17	The Appalachian Trail Conservancy may charge a fee for the		
18	authorization to request the registration plate. Upon request by		
19	the applicant, the department shall issue the plate for a		
20	passenger car or truck with a registered gross weight of not		
21	more than 14,000 pounds or a motor home. The fee provided under		
22	section 1931 (relating to special registration plates) shall		
23	apply.		
24	(b) ProceedsIt is the intent of the General Assembly that		
25	proceeds received by the Appalachian Trail Conservancy under		
26	this section are to be used exclusively for trail maintenance
