## AN ACT

Amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for duties of 2 electric distribution companies. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 5 Section 1. Section 2807(f)(2)(iii) of Title 66 of the 6 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 8 § 2807. Duties of electric distribution companies. 9 \* \* \* (f) Smart meter technology and time of use rates. --10 \* \* \* 11 12 Electric distribution companies shall furnish smart 13 meter technology as follows: 14 15 In accordance with a depreciation schedule not 16 to exceed 15 years. <u>Customers may opt out of receiving</u>

1	smart meter technology under this subparagraph by
2	notifying, in writing, the electric distribution company.
3	The following shall apply:
4	(A) The electric distribution company shall
5	provide an opt-out form to consumers upon request and
6	may provide a method for consumers to opt out
7	electronically through the electric distribution
8	<pre>company's Internet website.</pre>
9	(B) The commission shall create and regulate a
10	surcharge for consumers who elect to opt out of
11	receiving smart meter technology under this
12	subparagraph. The surcharge may include a one-time
13	fee and a monthly fee reflective of the actual costs
14	incurred by an electric distribution company to
15	install, read, maintain or service the meters of
16	customers who elect to opt out.

18	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
