Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for unlawful devices and methods. 2 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 2308(a)(7) and (8) of Title 34 of the 5 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: 6 7 § 2308. Unlawful devices and methods. 8 (a) General rule. -- Except as otherwise provided in this 9 title, it is unlawful for any person to hunt or aid, abet, 10 assist or conspire to hunt any game or wildlife through the use 11 of: * * * 12 13 (7) A vehicle or conveyance of any kind or its 14 attachment propelled by other than manpower. Nothing [in this 15 subsection] under this paragraph shall pertain to any 16 motorboat or sailboat if the motor has been completely shut 17 off or sail furled, and the progress thereof has ceased. person may not, when using a vehicle or conveyance under this

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paragraph, take big game on the property of another without
lawful permission from the owner of the property.

3 (8) Any artificial or natural bait, hay, grain, fruit, nut, salt, chemical, mineral or other food as an enticement 4 5 for game or wildlife, regardless of kind and quantity, or 6 take advantage of any such area or food or bait prior to 30 days after the removal of such material and its residue. 7 Nothing [contained in this subsection] under this paragraph 8 9 shall pertain to normal or accepted farming, habitat management practices, oil and gas drilling, mining, forest 10 management activities or other legitimate commercial or 11 12 industrial practices. Upon discovery of such baited areas, 13 whether prosecution is contemplated or not, the commission 14 may cause a reasonable area surrounding the enticement to be 15 posted against hunting or taking game or wildlife. The posters shall remain for 30 days after complete removal of 16 17 the bait.

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19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
