AN ACT

- Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 1 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for 3 surcharge for deposit into the Access to Justice Account. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Section 3733.1(a) and (c) of Title 42 of the 7 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: § 3733.1. Surcharge. 8 9 Imposition of surcharge. -- In addition to each fee imposed under section 3733(a.1) (relating to deposits into 10 11 account), except as set forth in subsection (b), the following 12 apply: 13 (1)A surcharge of [\$11.25] \$9.25 shall be charged and collected. This paragraph shall expire December 31, 2014.

- 15 A permanent fee of \$2.25 shall be charged and 16 collected.
- 17 (3) A permanent fee of \$2 shall be charged and
- 18 collected.

- 3 (1) The surcharge under subsection (a)(1) [shall be allocated as follows:
- 5 (i) One dollar shall be deposited into the Access to 6 Justice Account.
- 7 The remainder of money] shall be deposited into 8 a separate reserve account within the Judicial Computer 9 System Augmentation Account. Notwithstanding section 3732 10 (relating to utilization of funds in account), money 11 deposited under this [subparagraph] paragraph is hereby 12 appropriated to the Supreme Court, upon compliance with 13 Article XV of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), 14 known as The Fiscal Code, for the operation of the 15 Judicial Department.
- 16 (2) The fee under subsection (a)(2) shall be deposited 17 into the Criminal Justice Enhancement Account.
- 18 (3) The fee under subsection (a) (3) shall be deposited

 19 into the Access to Justice Account.
- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 30 days.
