## AN ACT

Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled, as amended, "An act to promote the public health and safety by providing for examination, licensing and granting of permits for those who desire to engage in the profession of cosmetology; defining cosmetology, and regulating cosmetology salons, schools, students, apprentices, teachers, managers, manicurists and cosmetologists; conferring powers and duties upon the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs in the Department of State; providing for appeals to 9 certain courts by applicants and licensees; and providing 10 penalties," providing for practice of massage therapy in 11 cosmetology salon or esthetician salon. 12 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 14 15 Section 1. The act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), referred 16 to as the Cosmetology Law, is amended by adding a section to 17 read: 18 Section 9.3. Practice of Massage Therapy in Cosmetology Salon or Esthetician Salon. -- (a) An individual licensed under 19 20 the act of October 9, 2008 (P.L.1438, No.118), known as the "Massage Therapy Law," shall be permitted to practice massage

- 1 therapy within the approved premises of a licensed cosmetology
- 2 salon or a licensed esthetician salon if the following
- 3 conditions are met:
- 4 (1) The massage therapy licensee is THE OWNER OF OR employed <--
- 5 by the salon and is not an independent contractor.
- 6 (2) The massage therapist practices in accordance with this
- 7 act and the Massage Therapy Law.
- 8 (3) The salon owner provides an appropriate level of privacy
- 9 <u>for clients in accordance with the following:</u>
- 10 (i) No physical barriers separating the areas used for
- 11 massage therapy from the areas used for cosmetology or esthetics
- 12 <u>shall be required when a massage therapist performs massage</u>
- 13 <u>services that a cosmetologist or esthetician is authorized to</u>
- 14 perform.
- 15 (ii) A salon owner shall be required to provide separate
- 16 massage therapy rooms with permanent walls and doors to ensure
- 17 privacy for clients receiving massage services from a massage
- 18 therapist when the services are beyond the practice of
- 19 cosmetology or esthetics.
- 20 (iii) In order to enhance client comfort, esthetician
- 21 services may be provided to a client in the same room where the
- 22 <u>client receives massage therapy, provided these services are not</u>
- 23 performed concurrently.
- 24 (b) A licensee under this section is subject to inspection
- 25 by the board and the State Board of Massage Therapy.
- 26 (c) A licensee under this section who violates this act or
- 27 the Massage Therapy law shall be subject to discipline by the
- 28 <u>licensee's applicable licensing board.</u>
- 29 (d) Within 18 months of the effective date of this section,
- 30 the State Board of Cosmetology and the State Board of Massage

- 1 Therapy shall jointly promulgate final regulations to carry out
- 2 the provisions of this section.
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
