AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, providing for religious educational facilities.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
11	section to read:
12	Section 1338.3. Religious Educational Facilities(a) It
13	is the policy of the Commonwealth to preserve the primary right
14	and the obligation of the parent or parents, or person or
15	persons in loco parentis to a child, to choose the education and
16	training for such child. It is likewise the policy of the
17	Commonwealth to avoid imposing substantial burdens on the
18	religious liberties of educational ministries without compelling

1 <u>justification.</u>

2	(b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, nothing	
3	contained in this act or in any law of this Commonwealth shall	
4	empower the Commonwealth, any of its officers, agencies or	
5	subdivisions to mandate or approve the course or program	
6	content, curriculum, faculty, staff, training or principles of	
7	religious development or spiritual formation of any religious	
8	educational facility.	
9	(c) A religious educational facility shall be subject to the	
10	applicable background check and child abuse reporting	
11	requirements of this act and 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 (relating to	
12	child protective services).	
13	(d) Nothing contained in this section shall prevent the	
14	<u>Commonwealth from:</u>	
15	(1) Adopting or enforcing any regulations which prevent	
16	threats to the physical health or safety of individuals or	
17	unsanitary or dangerous conditions in religious educational	
18	facilities or which prohibit any form of child abuse as defined	
19	<u>in 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63.</u>	
20	(2) Imposing any staff-child ratio requirements or staff	
21	training requirements that are necessary to prevent threats to	
22	the physical health or safety of individuals or unsanitary or	
23	dangerous conditions in religious educational facilities,	
24	provided that no minimum staffing requirements shall be imposed	
25	on any before-school program or after-school program that is	
26	operated on the premises of a religious school, that is staffed	
27	by the regular classroom teachers or staff members at that	
28	school and that maintains staff-child ratios that are	
29	substantially the same as those maintained during the regular	
30	<u>school day.</u>	
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1	(3) Requiring that a religious educational facility submit
2	to annual or emergency inspections as authorized by statute.
3	(4) Requiring that a religious educational facility comply
4	with all applicable requirements of any statute, regulation or
5	program guidance under which governmental funding is provided to
6	the facility, including, but not limited to, Head Start, Pre-K
7	Counts, child care assistance or child care services or any
8	other program funded by appropriations made by the General
9	Assembly.
10	(e) A religious educational facility shall comply with
11	generally applicable State statutes and regulations relating to
12	health and safety promulgated by the Department of Agriculture,
13	the Department of Environmental Protection, the Department of
14	Health, the Department of Labor and Industry, the Department of
15	Transportation or by any political subdivision, and with
16	generally applicable health and safety requirements or generally
17	applicable building and zoning requirements adopted by a
18	political subdivision.
19	(f) The terms in this section shall have the following
20	definitions:
21	"Before-school program" or "after-school program" means a
22	program for pupils attending a religious kindergarten,
23	elementary school or secondary school that is operated for no
24	more than five (5) hours per day on the premises of the
25	religious school attended by the pupils of that school during
26	the regular academic year and is staffed by regular classroom
27	teachers or staff members at that school.
28	"Prekindergarten," "preschool," or "nursery school" means a
29	school which maintains or conducts classes for the purpose of
30	offering instruction and learning experiences to a minimum of

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1	five (5) pupils for not less than two (2) hours per day nor more
2	<u>than six (6) hours per day and for at least sixty (60) days per</u>
3	<u>academic calendar year. A prekindergarten, preschool or nursery</u>
4	school that is affiliated with and is operated on the premises
5	<u>of a religious kindergarten, elementary school or secondary</u>
6	school may operate for up to seven (7) hours per day if its
7	hours of operation coincide with the instructional day of the
8	school with which it is affiliated. A religious prekindergarten,
9	preschool or nursery school shall register with the Department
10	of Education in the same manner as prescribed by regulation for
11	religious schools that are described in section 1327(b).
12	"Religious educational facility" means a prekindergarten,
13	preschool, nursery school, before-school program or after-school
14	program or school vacation program for children who have
15	attained two (2) years and seven (7) months of age or older,
16	operated by any church, association of churches or other
17	religious order, body or institution which qualifies for
18	exemption from taxation under section 501(c)(3) or (d) of the
19	Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. §
20	<u>501).</u>
21	"School vacation program" means an instructional program
22	operated by a religious elementary school or secondary school or
23	a vacation Bible school or other similar program which
24	incorporates religious instruction, training, learning
25	experiences or principles of religious development or spiritual
26	formation during the days when school is not open.
27	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
